

## Orthodox Theologian To Speak Here

A renowned Orthodox theologian will speak at the next meeting of the Rochester Area Ministerial Fellowship on Monday, Feb. 26.

The meeting will take place at the parish center of Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church, 952 East Ave.

Rev. Alexander Schmemmann, dean of St. Vladimir's Orthodox Seminary in Tuckahoe, N.Y., will speak on "The Orthodox Church: Bridge between Catholicism and Protestantism."

The morning meeting will begin promptly at 9:30 a.m. according to co-chairmen Father John Philipps of St. Louis Church, Pittsford, and Father George Nicozisin of Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church.

The guest speaker is the author of several theological works, and attended Vatican II Council—as an Orthodox observer.

Dear Friends of POP,

We're pleased that so many of you have been making turns—keep up the good work! When labels are brought or sent in regularly—rather than reserved until the very end of the Game—it makes our job much easier.

However, we would once again ask your cooperation in counting bottle caps. Please make sure that Pepsi and Seven Up caps are packaged and counted separately. (Regular and Diet Pepsi caps need not be separated.) Also, include only caps from POP products. We can't give points for those from other soft drinks. The same rule applies to all POP products. **Tuna 'N' Chip Casserole**

2 cans tuna chunks  
1/2 cup sour cream or light cream soured with lemon juice  
1 tbl. minced parsley or chives  
1 4 oz. bag Wise Potato Chips, coarsely crushed  
1 can condensed green pea soup  
1/2 cup (or slightly less) milk  
1/4 lb. sliced American cheese, silvered

Drain tuna and separate into smaller pieces. Blend with sour cream. Blend 1/2 of crushed potato chips with tuna mixture. Stir milk into soup until smooth. Add tuna mixture and blend well. Pour into 2 qt. oiled casserole and top with remaining potato chips and cheese. Bake in 350° F. oven for 20 to 25 min. Serve hot with green salad or cold slaw. Serves 6.

**POP Chili Con Carne**

1 onion chopped  
1/2 green pepper sliced  
1 lb. ground beef  
1 can Hunt's Tomato Sauce  
1 can Hunt's Tomato Paste  
1 can chili beans  
2 tsp. chili powder

Brown onion and pepper until tender. Remove from skillet and brown beef in drippings. Add tomato sauce, tomato paste and onion-pepper. Simmer mixture (covered) for 15 min. Add chili beans and chili powder and simmer an additional 15 min. Serve over cooked rice or with crackers.

Dr. Jeanne Noble, a sociologist who lately played a consulting role here, will be the speaker at the sixth annual Women's Forum, planned for Thursday noon, Feb. 28, at the Jewish Community Center.

## What's This? LSD And a 'Love-In' at A Parish Library?

Some kind of a prize for imaginative publicity should go to St. Michael's parish, which is billing its Lenten Series Dialog (LSD) as a "love in."

Lavery, CSS, president of St. John Fisher College; March 29 — Father Joseph Geritz, SJ, principal of McQuaid Jesuit High School.

Parish publicity notes that since "love is a many splendored thing," the insights of priests representing five different religious orders were sought for this Lenten happening.

Father Benedict Ehmann, St. Michael's pastor, will summarize the Lenten Series Dialog on the last Friday, April 5.

### Antioch Patriarch Dies

Beirut, Lebanon — (NC) — Ignace Cardinal Tappouni, Patriarch of Antioch of the Syrians, died of a heart attack here at the age of 88.

From his residence here he had jurisdiction over all Catholics of the Syrian rite, most of them in the Near East — Lebanon, Syria, Egypt and Iraq. There are 7,000 in the United States.
