Dr. Jeanne Noble, a sociologist who lately played a consulting role here, will be the speaker at the sixth annual Women's Forum, planned for Thursday noon, Feb. 29, at the Jewish Community Center.

The event is sponsored by National Council of Catholic Women, the National Council of Jewish Women, the United Church Women and the Young Women's Christian Association.

Dr. Noble is on the staff of the School of Education in New York University's Center for Human Relations. Her address is entitled "New Dimensions in Today's World." She recently advised Rochester Public Safety officials on communication between police and the Negro community.

What's This? LSD And a 'Love-In' at A Parish Library?

Some kind of a prize for imaginative publicity should go to St. Michael's parish, which is billing its Lenten Series Dialog (LSD) as a "love in."

It's not inaccurate for the theme of the six week series is the famous dissertation on Christian charity found in St. Paul's first epistle to the Corinthians.

Each Friday in Lent a different priest speaker will highlight one facet of the famous message, and then lead a dialog on the topic. The series is billed for St. Michael's parish library, located at 877 Clinton Ave., North, and will start promptly at 7:30 p.m.

Antioch Patriarch Dies

Beirut, Lebanon — (NC) — Ignace Cardinal Tappouni, Patriarch of Antioch of the Syrians, died of a heart attack here at the age of 88.

From his residence here he had jurisdiction over all Catholics of the Syrian rite, most of them in the Near East — Lebanon, Syria, Egypt and Iraq. There are 7,000 in the United States.
