

144 Students Named Regents Scholars

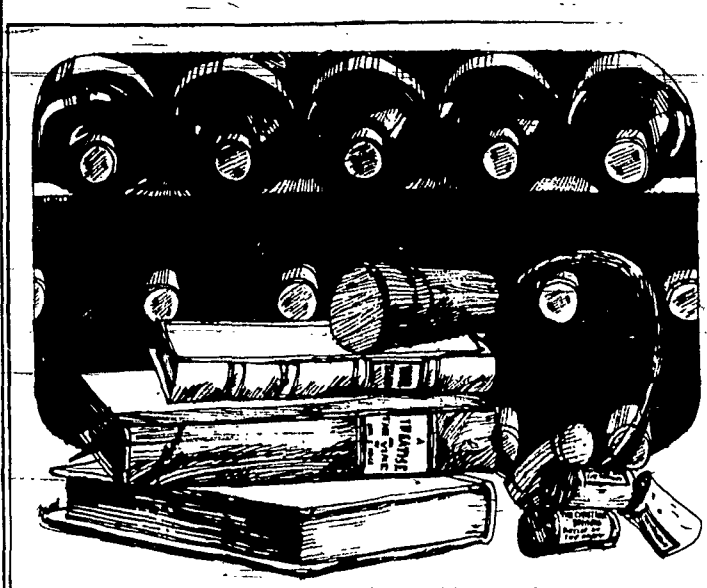
