

Mooney Favored in Diocesan Cage Tourney

The 10th annual Rochester Diocesan High School Basketball Tournament opens March 8 with quarter final games scheduled in Rochester, Auburn and Elmira according to John Crego, general chairman of the tournament.

The Rochester War Memorial will be the scene of the opening doubleheader on Saturday, March 9.

Cardinal Mooney (16-2) winner of the Rochester Catholic League Championship will meet DeSales High School of Geneva in the opening game at 7:30 p.m.

The second game will pit McQuaid Jesuit (9-8) against Notre Dame of Elmira (13-5).

The teams that Aquinas and Bishop Kearney will face in the quarter finals won't be determined until they play one another tonight (March 1).

The winner of the Aquinas Kearney game will play Mt.

Carmel (12-5) at the Auburn Community College gym, Friday, March 8 at 8:15 p.m.

The loser will face the number one rated school from outside the Rochester area, St. Anthony of Padua (11-3) from Watkins Glen. The game will be played Saturday, March 9 on the neutral Notre Dame of Elmira court at 7:30 p.m.

Cardinal Mooney with a fine (15-2) record has to be considered the team to beat this year again. It is undefeated against all Catholic opposition, twice beating Aquinas, Bishop

Kearney, McQuaid and Notre Dame. The Cardinals' ball control offense and near-perfect pressing defense puts every team it plays to a ball handling test.

Padua has an eye on the Diocesan Championship and has a fine record to back up its claim. Its three losses (11-3) were by a total of just six points. Padua is a team that makes up in speed for lack of height, and likes to play stiff defense countered by bull's-eye outside shooting.

The Mt. Carmel High School

Crusaders enter the tournament with the best basketball season in history of the school. That they are capable of going all the way is attested to their recent victory over Bishop Kearney and a slim 4 point early season loss to McQuaid.

McQuaid lacking in height, utilizes a deliberate ball-control offense which will be put to the test by the Crusaders' aggressive 24-1 zone press. The McQuaid attack is built around the scoring and rebounding of junior Nick Combs and the play making of senior Brad Smith. Aquinas and Bishop Kearney will be hoping to put together three fine consecutive performances and come away with the trophy.

It all shapes up to be one of the most exciting tournaments in the most exciting history of the Diocesan Championship.

"There's no problem," beautiful white-girl confidely assures her handsome fiancé — a Negro — as she takes him home to meet her parents, but known for their liberal views.

There is a problem, as turns out in "Guess Who's Coming to Dinner?", but not compared to the problem of film itself faces: is the American public ready for a motion picture that treats racial intermarriage not only pathetically but comically well?

If such a film can succeed now, it will be this because of its audience-attraction for nothing else.
