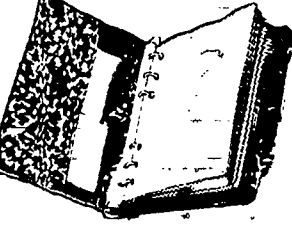

Berlin—(NC)—Stefan Cardinal Wyszyński of Warsaw, Poland, assailed what he called "enforced atheism" in Poland in a Lenten pastoral read in the country's parishes. The cardinal further charged that religion is deprived of a "means of defense" through radio, television, the theater and publications.
