**Card Party Will Assist
City Jesuit in India**

The annual St. Patrick's Card Party to assist Father Michael F. Kavanaugh, Jesuit missionary from Rochester working in India will be held Saturday, March 16, at 1 p.m. in St. Augustine's School hall.

Father Kavanaugh has charge of the St. Anthony's Church Social Welfare Centre at Dhanbad, India. He has 15 villages of lepers located in his parish.

In a letter dated Feb. 16, he tells of the value of the yearly card parties. "We are getting large funds for the leprosy program and it is wonderful! The German Leprosy Association has just granted twenty thousand dollars for building a small hospital, storage room, 3 servants' quarters and the entire salaries of the sisters and staff for the year."

"But right now, I have no cash to give anyone. Little things like fifty-cents to give aid men for a pair of rubber shoes. His sores on the bottom of his feet were open and he had to walk on them. Two dollars would make six pairs for the ragamuffin boys helping out around here. We got old bags from grains that we can use but we need who pay the tailor. I haven't got a cent! It is the little donations that keep me going. Your March card party proceeds last me practically the whole year, to take care of my own personal dispensations. I like to have a can of chocolate, to mix up a cup for the kids that do odd jobs around. It costs about a dollar a week."

Mrs. Fred Dittman is chairman of the party.

Here's a recipe which uses not just one, but three of Prince's fine products. It's the ticket for these cold winter days when something hot and filling is called for.

Chicken Cacciatore With Noodles
1/2 cup olive or cooking oil
1 3-lb. broiling chicken, cut up
2 pint jars Prince Cacciatore Sauce
1 tsp. salt
1/4 tsp. pepper
1 clove garlic, minced
1 12-oz. pkg. Prince Medium Egg Noodles
Prince Parmesan or Romano Grated Cheese

Heat oil in skillet. Fry chicken in oil until brown on all sides. Combine Cacciatore Sauce, salt, pepper and garlic; pour over chicken. Simmer, covered, 25 minutes or until chicken is almost tender. Cook, uncovered, 5 minutes more or until tender. About 10 minutes before chicken is done, cook noodles according to pkg. directions. Drain, and arrange chicken and noodles on a platter. Sprinkle with grated cheese. Serves 4-6.

Fruit-Cheese Pie
1 pkg. Royal Gelatin (any flavor)
1 pkg. whipped topping mix
1 pkg. frozen fruit or 1 cup canned fruit (to match Gelatin flavor)
2 tblsp. corn starch or Tapioca
1 Bunch pie shell, graham cracker or baked

Prepare Gelatin according to pkg. directions. Chill until slightly set. Whip topping mix according to pkg. directions. Whip chilled gelatin until foamy and fold in whipped topping. Pour into pie shell and chill until firm. Drain fruit, reserving 1/2 cup juice. Combine juice with corn starch or Tapioca and bring to a boil. Mix with drained fruit and cover top of pie.
