## Double, Two Singles On Basketball Tournery Card

The 10th annual Diocesan High School Basketball Tournament opens tonight at Auburn Community College, with Aquinas of Rochester playing Mt. Carmel of Auburn. The quarter-final game begins at 8:15.

A semi-final doubleheader tomorrow night in the Rochester War Memorial pits DeSales of Mooney, at 7:30, and McQuaid of Rochester against Notre Dame of Elmira at 9.

At 2:30 Sunday afternoon, at Notre Dame, Elmira, Bishop Kearney of Rochester meets the St. Anthony of Padua team from Watkins Glen.

Darkhorse DeSales, with an indifferent season record (6-9), faces Mooney tomorrow in a winning mood, after three consecutive victories, the latest, 73-67 over favored Mt. Carmel. Mooney (15-2) won the Rochester Catholic League championship and topped all Catholic opposition through the season.

The winner of Saturday's second game, Notre Dame or McQuaid, could easily go all the way to the finals. It could bring about a third encounter with the Mooney team that twice has taken the measure of both McQuaid and Notre Dame during regular season play. Another crack at Mooney makes this Saturday's game a real incentive for both teams.

McQuaid, with an up and down season to date, 10 wins and 8 losses, has shown sparks of brilliance, but not often enough to win with any consistency. However, in recent games, McQuaid has given every indication of putting their game together.

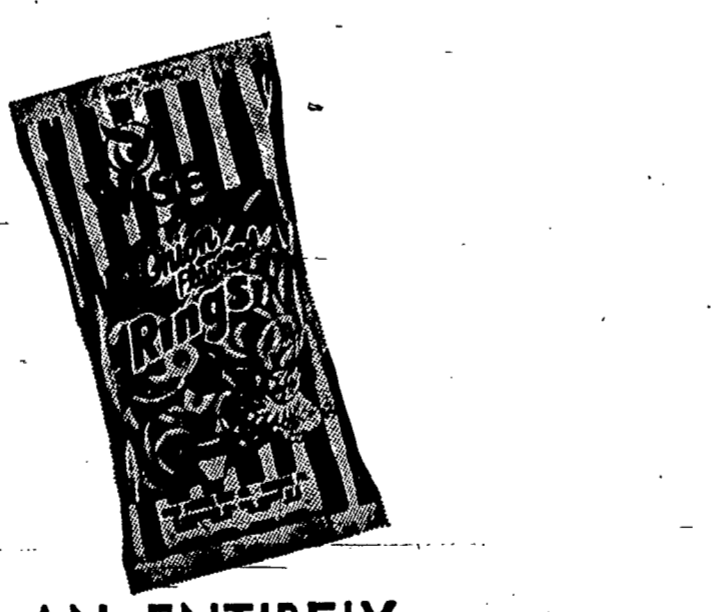
