

Liturgical Changes Announced: U.S. Bishops Lose on Two Points

Washington (NC)—The Vatican has authorized several minor changes in the American liturgy, but has rejected two of the suggestions made last November by the U.S. Bishops' Conference.

Archbishop John F. Dearden of Detroit, president of the conference, announced that the bishops did not get permission to designate academic centers as supervisors of liturgical innovation. Their request that some experimentation be approved without prior examination by the Holy See also was turned down. These were their major proposals for greater leeway in forming new liturgy.

The changes include:—Authorization for the use of two texts of the Book of Psalms, the text published by England's Grail Society and the psalter of the Jerusalem Bible published in the U.S. in 1966, in addition to the already approved Confraternity of Christian Doctrine text.

—Omission of any reference to excommunication or other ecclesiastical penalty in the formula for absolution in the sacrament of Penance "unless there be some indication that a censure was incurred."

—Substitution of "an approved Eucharistic hymn in praise of the Blessed Sacrament" at Benediction in place of the Latin hymn Tantum Ergo.

—Authorization for the use of vernacular texts set to music composed in earlier periods, even though these texts may

not conform in all details with the approved version of contemporary liturgical texts. This will allow use of traditional choral and other music in English.

—Permission for the use of musical instruments other than the organ in liturgical services, provided they are played in a manner suitable to public worship.

Explaining the refusal of the bishops' major proposals, Archbishop Dearden said: "While the two major proposals concerning liturgical experimentation were not approved at the present time, it is clear that the Consilium is open to the

submission of rites and texts of liturgical adaptations which have been drawn up and presented prior to actual experimental use.

"Concrete proposals of rites and texts may continue to be sent to the Bishops' Committee on the Liturgy," the archbishop added.

With his statement of the Vatican-approved changes, Archbishop Dearden also announced that an experiment with the liturgical services for the Baptism of adults will take place this Lent in about 20 American dioceses. The rite was formulated on the basis of extensive proposals from many countries.

B'nai B'rith Unit Upholds Award To Father Groppi

Milwaukee (RNS)—Delegates to the Milwaukee B'nai B'rith Council voted unanimously here to back a decision to give Father James E. Groppi an award for his efforts in behalf of human rights. Petitions signed by some 700 Jews have opposed the award.

Father Groppi, controversial priest of St. Boniface Catholic church and adviser to the Milwaukee NAACP Youth Council, will receive the award at a dinner Mar. 10 at the Jewish Community Center.

The action by the 50 Council delegates was taken at a reportedly noisy three hour meeting from which reporters were barred.

Superiors Seek "United Voice"

Milwaukee (RNS)—An organization has been formed by other superiors of 15 communities of nuns in the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Milwaukee to express "a united voice" in stating positions on current issues in the church and in society.

One function of the new Conference of Major Superiors of Women Religious - Milwaukee will be to take unified action in the fields of education, social and hospital work and other activities.

An advisory council of laymen and clergymen which will include Frank Zeidler, former mayor of Milwaukee, a Lutheran, will assist the superiors.

Public Schools Urged To Stress Moral Values

Lansing (RNS)—Michigan's Board of Education has called for accelerated concern for morality on the part of students and teachers.

A resolution passed by the board stated that "a teacher should seek to interest students in the need for moral considerations and to show them how to judge their own affairs and the affairs of men in terms of moral values."

The endorsed resolution also said that "to moralize and to impose a uniform or prescribed morality on youngsters, especially in a pluralistic society

is not a proper function of public education or of government for that matter."

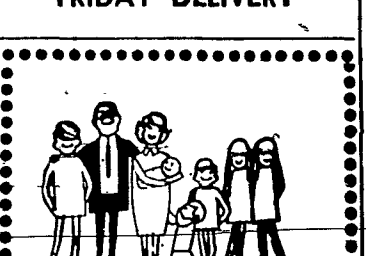

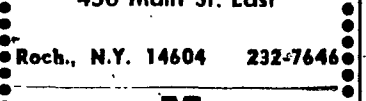

New York Archbishop Named

New York (RNS)—Archbishop designate Terence J. Cooke, 44, a colossal task as spiritual leader of the Archdiocese of New York, sprawling archdiocese of counties, almost anyone of could be made into a diocese.

The prevalent opinion is that the role of Archbishop of New York is entirely too big a job for a New York priest. Many priests envy the responsibility of one of the world's greatest dioceses through what promises to be the most difficult era in its history.
