"The War Game"—a semi-documentary showing the potential horror and destruction of nuclear war.  
Father Steele said the films were selected to show various forms of life through death - which is "also the theme of the Lenten season." "Through the 'real world,' we hope to see the real world of redemption in our times."

The Catholic Bishops' Secretariat for Catholic-Jewish relations issued a statement here warning Christians against using Passion Plays, or sermons and teachings on the Passion, as a source of anti-Semitism.  
It emphasized that the Passion and death of Christ must not be attributed to the Jewish people of all time, and pointed to the Vatican Council's declaration on relations with the Jews which clearly stated that
