Druggist Offers Prescription For Peace

New York—A Vermont pharmacist has volunteered to help compound Pope Paul's prescription for peace in the Holy Land.

Eugene Kayatta, 48, of Manchester, Vermont, left here to live in a pilgrim's hostel in Jerusalem and help the Pontifical Mission for Palestine.

The Pope's mission administers large doses of relief and self help rehabilitation for refugees and other victims of the Arab-Israeli wars.

Rhode Island-born Mr. Kayatta will advise field workers in job re-training, small business redevelopment, credit unions, finance management, school administration and, as he says, "anything else that can help war-wrecked families get back on their feet."

In his 26-year pharmaceuticals career, Mr. Kayatta has been administrator of a 300-bed Navy hospital, high school science teacher, school board chairman and entrepreneur for a series of prospering New England drug stores.

Msgr. John G. Nolan, president of the Pontifical Mission and executive head of the Catholic Near East Welfare Association, said it is the first time a professional American business organizer has donated his services to the papal mission overseas. "It's an experiment in neighborliness," said the monsignor.

Mr. Kayatta's usefulness can begin right away. From his Syrian-born grandparents, he learned Arabic—usually an obstacle to Americans in the Middle East.

He said he began to get his own ideas about applying the Pope's formula to ease Middle Eastern tensions while touring his ancestral homelands in the Levant last year.

"I saw many ways I could help: simple bits of advice that New England neighbors exchange every day. I also saw how a few words in Arabic opened doors and minds."

He chose Jerusalem as a base because it is a hive of small businesses and schools upset by the June war.

If necessary, Mr. Kayatta is prepared to give up six months of developing his own business, comfortable family life, and the skiing and golfing he enjoys in the Manchester valley.

Eugene and Nelda Murdoch Kayatta have been steady contributors to Pope Paul's peace-repairing mission in the Holy Land. They have also paid for the seminary training of six priests from poor Middle East families—though their own two children are in college.

Gene Kayatta explains his latest venture as a corollary of the self-help principle:

Just as it makes more economic sense to give poor people tools instead of a hand-out—and further dependence on the American dollar—maybe successful Americans can learn to give a little of the know-how that makes those dollars possible.

But he is modest about what he hopes to achieve. "Maybe I can be home in three months, if that's what it takes to give whatever I have. The moment I begin to feel useless, I'll take the next plane out; I have too many other useful things to do right here."

He mused: "Maybe it's a little too easy for Americans to give money, to buy our way out of other peoples' disasters. Maybe a little of ourselves is what is needed even more. I think it's worth finding out."
