There are several kinds of marriageimpediments:

1. Mixed Religion: This impediment is present should your fiancee be a baptized Protestant. We spoke of this earlier, and how the Bishop would want to be assured that you, as a member of his flock, would not be endangering your faiths in any way by entering this union. When you assure him of this, he would then grant a dispensation.

2. Age: Church law states that the minimum-age for Catholics anywhere is 16 years old for the man, and 14 years old for the woman. However, in those countries where civil law prescribes a higher minimum age, as in New York State, the Church law escalates the minimum age to be the same as the civil law. Therefore, in New F York State, Church law is 21 for the man and 18 for the woman, except with parental permission.

3. "Previous Bond.": This Taw states that one who has contracted a real (valid) marriage cannot enter a sec-
