Shut-ins, Elderly Have Big Day

Easter Wednesday (April 17) was a banner day for the shut-ins and many Senior Citizens of Holy Family parish in Rochester.

Many of them attended Mass that evening for the first time in many years, thanks to the assistance of friends and fellow parishioners.

Some arrived in wheelchairs in a mobile truck provided by the St. Sig Center, others came in private cars, staffed by a capable crew of volunteers.

Bishop Sheen offered Mass in the Ames Street church, then attended a coffee and cake reception for the infirm and elderly people in the parish hall.

Everybody in the front row at Mass was on wheels — wheelchairs, that is.

Bishop Sheen's message was right on target for this special congregation.

"You are continuing — in a mysterious way — the Passion of Christ," he told his hearers. "You are victims and because you offer yourselves, you are also priests in a very real way."

He recounted the story of a parishioner whose husband was an atheist. The woman contracted a serious illness, was crippled for nine years, before she died. She told her husband before her death that she had been offering her pain for him, predicted that one day he would not only be converted but would become a priest as well.

"On a visit to Lourdes, much later, that man was touched by grace, came into the Church and later was ordained a Dominican priest," the bishop concluded.

The idea for the occasion stemmed from the home Mass program being conducted in Holy Family parish. Mrs. Robert Huebner, chairman of the program, found that there were quite a number of invalids who could not get out, even to a neighbor's house, unless they had special assistance.

"We decided to plan a Mass for our 30 shut-ins and invite other Senior Citizens to attend," she explained. Deciding on an arbitrary age of 65 to qualify, her committee found that the parish had 476 Senior Citizens. All were issued a personal invitation to attend the Easter Wednesday Mass, including those in good health who were able to come to Mass regularly.

Parishioners pitched in wholeheartedly. A Mothers' Circle provided coffee and cookies; Cadet Girl Scouts served the refreshments. Custodian George Mathis built two ramps for wheelchairs, one for the church, one for the hall, so that those on wheels could glide in smoothly.

First home Mass in the parish, incidentally, was at the parish rectory, where Monsignor George Cocuzzi, pastor, invited neighbors to participate. Since then there have been 20 other home Masses, which led to the "home Mass in church" for the shut-ins.

The weather was warm and so was the competition last week for McQuaid's baseball and track teams.

The Knights' baseball squad came from behind with 5 runs in the last inning of regulation play and finally edged Gates-Chili, 7-6, in the sixth to provide relief pitcher Tom Combs with the opening game victory. Ray O'Neill's game-tying homerun with two out in the seventh was the big blow of the afternoon.
