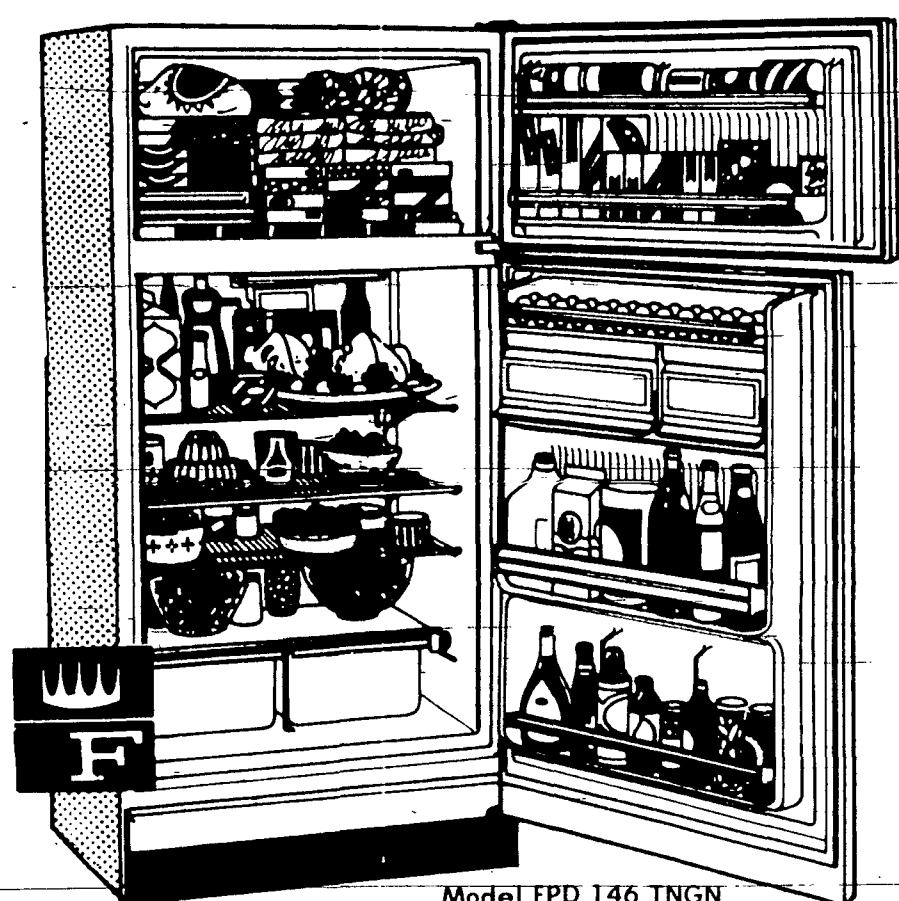

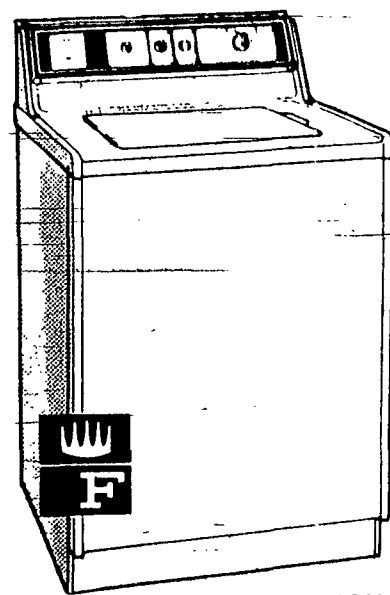

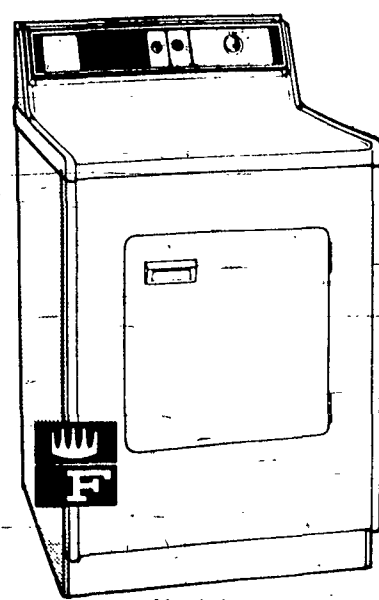

Father John R. V.C.S.B., librarian at Aquinas, was named 1968 winner of the Award of Merit of the Catholic Library Association in recognition of his contributions to Catholic librarianship. The award was made in conjunction with the 44th Conference of the Catholic Library Association meeting in Paul, Minn.

The president of the Library Association, Father Lang, O.F.M., of College, Quincy, Ill., and Jerome Frasher of Sacred Seminary, Detroit, chair the high school section of the presentation.

Father Whitley presented paper discussing new standards for school libraries. Chair meeting was Dr. Carl Whitenack of Purdue University, president of the Association of School Librarians.

Father Whitley is the sole Library Association representative to the American Association of School Librarians and serves on the board of the National Education Association. Last month with legislative committee in Washington to discuss federal monies for education.

The setting for this Williams' thriller is the ground for most English side tales—an old British estate, complete with wing mistress, grand clock, and ancient furniture.

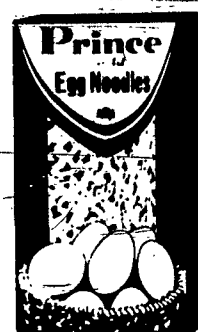
