Aquinas Librarian Wins Award at National Meeting

Father John R. Whitley, C.S.B., librarian at Aquinas Institute, was named 1968 recipient of the Award of Merit by the Catholic Library Association in recognition of his contributions to Catholic librarianship. The award was made in conjunction with the 44th Annual Conference of the Catholic Library Association meeting in St. Paul, Minn.

The president of the Catholic Library Association, Father John Lang, O.P.M., of Quincy College, Quincy, Ill., and Father Jerome Frasher of Sacred Heart Seminary, Detroit, chairman of the high school section, made the presentation.

Father Whitley presented a paper discussing new standards for school libraries. Chairing the meeting was Dr. Carolyn I. Whitenack of Purdue University, president of the American Association of School Librarians.

Father Whitley is the Catholic Library Association's representative to the American Association of School Librarians and serves on the advisory board of the National Education Association. Last month he worked with legislative committees in Washington to discuss funding of federal monies for secondary education.

The Basilian priest is the author of *A Planning Guide to Scholarships* and edited *Best in Catholic Reading*. He is a regular contributor to library literature. A graduate of the University of Windsor, he has a library degree from the University of Toronto and a master of education degree from the University of Rochester.

Father Robert F. McNamara is a native and a priest of the Diocese of Rochester. Since 1938 he has been professor of Church History at St. Bernard's, the Rochester diocesan theological seminary. Most important among his writings on church and local history are his two earlier books, "A Century of Grace" (1948) was a "life-sized" centennial history of his home parish, St. Mary's, Corning, New York. "The American College in Rome, (1855-1955)" (Rochester, 1956) was a definitive account of the famous North American College in Rome, Italy, of which Father McNamara is an alumnus. He has been working ten years on "The Diocese of Rochester," which Bishop James E. Kearney of Rochester asked him to undertake in 1958. He is also active in the field of liturgical arts and architecture.

The book is a Must for all libraries and institutions of higher learning in western New York, in general, and students of any major or minor school of education, of church-state relations, or to any reader who enjoys a narrative of sweeping proportion. This book will be a treasure.
