Science Building Due to Open at St. John Fisher

The future science building at St. John Fisher College will open in the fall, school authorities predicted this week, as the first finished fruit of the Joint College Fund on the Fisher campus.

Fund money allotted to the men's college was earmarked for a science building, a library and a student union when the diocesan pledge campaign ended in December, 1965.

As the science building (still waiting for a name) is being rushed for fall completion, the library has been stalled because the Federal government has frozen all programs of grants for college construction. Government money had been expected to supplement the JCF funds for this building.

The student union is "still in the budget plans," college officers said, but no specific drawings nor construction expectations could be announced.

Nazareth Arts Center: A Promise Comes True

The promise that all of Rochester and the diocese would profit from the cultural note that would be sounded from Nazareth College has found rich fulfillment in the Arts Center which opened last October.

For both the Nazareth and St. John Fisher communities, as well as Rochester as a whole, have kept the building in constant demand.

In terms of the students themselves and their relation-

ship to the Arts Center, Sister Magdalen, chairman of the Art Department said, "We've all just begun to explore the potentials of the building. It's taking us a while to grow into doing things now that were before impossible. The students have done much with the building already... it's such a comfortable, convenient environment in which to be creative... Already this has paid enormous dividends."

Clean, Uncluttered

A stroll across the courtyard,

a wide expanse of grass dotted with sculptures done by the students themselves, and into the clean, uncluttered corridors of the building itself, bears Sister Magdalen out.

There's a creative, relaxed but electric undercurrent to the place. In the music wing, there's a whole string of eight rooms, complete with a piano and wall-to-wall carpeting, where students can practice.

A massive walnut table dominates rooms on both the upper

and lower levels where English students gather for seminars. This around-the-circle, face-to-face confrontation lends a note of unity and informality to the discussions.

The art studios abound with facilities for expression in various media: clay, oils, charcoal, sculpture. In addition to the large lobby-gallery, which hosts a changing showing of art works, there's a smaller gallery in which student work is on display.

Cultural Magnet

That the Arts Center has become a magnet for the cultural life of Rochester is borne out by the many groups who have made use of the galleries and the auditorium. The program has been varied in content and in style: The Civic Music Association, Erick Hawkins Modern Dance Company, The Theater of the Deaf, Marcel Marceau.

More recently, such people as Segovia, the Marlboro Festival Players and Geraldine Fitzgerald have lived up to the precedent set by the appearance of Brooks Atkinson back in October.

Joe Baranowski, head of the drama department at Nazareth, has worked with many of the productions which have come to the Arts Center. Of the Center's first season, he had this to say:

"Obviously, it's been a very busy, eventful year—between the school's activities here and those which involved outside groups. The professional performers who have come here have been very impressed with our facilities. And their coming here has made the Arts Center a place, not only to learn, but to encounter the fine arts firsthand."

Making a Difference

The exciting program could not help but make a difference to the Rochester community. Weekend after weekend people have traveled long distances from all corners of the diocese to get in on the action that's taking place at the Arts Center. And presentations such as that of "Doctor Faustus" and the Paul Sansardo Dance Company have involved Rochesterians in the productions themselves.

According to Sister Magdalen, next fall there will be art courses for Rochesterians available at night. Plans are also in the making for art classes for small children to be held on Saturday mornings.

Walking out of the side door, across the parking lot and up the grassy hill in the back, one can see the clean, bold lines that the Arts Center cuts across the horizon. And one can sense the creative, pulsating life that it exudes across the campus, down East Avenue and into the community of man in all directions.
