### Press Reaction to Plan Favorable

London—(RNS)—Press reaction to the draft plan for union of the Church of England (Anglican) and British Methodism has been generally favorable.

The Methodist Recorder, leading independent denominational newspaper, said the Unity Commission's recent (and final) report "has provided a substantial case. . . . We can go forward, we should go forward, and this is a reasonable way."

The Church Times, leading

independent Anglican journal, congratulated the Unity Commission and declared, "Certainly no scheme is ever likely to be put forward which is more concerned to allay Anglican fears."

"It must be said bluntly that if the Church of England rejects this reunion scheme, it is likely to reject all reunion schemes."

The proposed plan of union won support from the inter-denominational fortnightly, New

Christian, on the grounds that the issues dividing the two Churches are peripheral to the church's main work of mission.

"Does it matter two hoots," the journal asked, "whether the church's leaders are called bishops or chairmen . . . when the church is faced with the gigantic responsibility of helping men to find a way out of war, racial strife and hunger to peace and security?"

The Church Times said the unity scheme deserved acceptance, "not as a norm or precedent but in itself," and the nonconformist British Weekly observed that "the world needs a demonstration that Christians of whatever denomination are prepared to get together to present the faith to the world."

### Churchmen Hit Union Plan

London—(RNS)—Two noted churchmen—the former Archbishop of Canterbury, Lord Fisher of Lambeth, and Dr. Leslie A. Newman, a Methodist leader—are among the first critics of the plan for union of the Church of England (Anglican) and the Methodist Church.

The plan, providing for union in two stages, was published by the Anglican-Methodist Unity Commission.

It provides for full communion in the first stage, with the Methodist Church becoming an episcopal body, and a second stage of full organic union. It was immediately welcomed as a step forward by leading newspapers of both Churches, and

others, but now the first criticism is being sounded.

Lord Fisher, who made a speech in 1946 which is generally regarded as initiating conversation between the two Churches, declared "I am profoundly unhappy about some of the doctrines of the Church of England which the report abandons and about one or two doctrines which it imports."

The former Archbishop of Canterbury was a strong critic of earlier proposals for integrating the ministries of the two Churches by means of a reconciliation service. The proposals have now been revised and these will be two Services of Reconciliation.

### Dance Theater Set At Arts Center

Dance Theatre of Rochester JYM&WA will present the Paul Canasardo Dance Company in a performance at the Nazareth Arts Center May 5 at 8:15 p.m.

Paul Canasardo has contributed to the growth of modern dance in Rochester, since a member of his troupe flies in from New York City weekly to teach at Nazareth.

The program on May 5 will include a world premiere, "The Descent" based on Genesis and choreographed by Mr. Canasardo, as well as two other dances recently premiered. One of the latter is Manuel Alon's "Palomas," which received its initial performance to critical acclaim last month.
