

Aquinas Guard Finds Practice Pays Off

Happiness for one group of Aquinas students is performing an intricate marching drill featuring subtle flag movements and breathtaking rifle twirls before a large audience.

This group, the Aquinas Institute Color Guard, was very happy last Saturday night in Kenmore, N.Y., when they captured the International Color Guard Circuit championship. This was the second year in a row that the local boys took first place. The circuit is made up of the top guards in New York State, Ontario and Quebec.

Color guard shows are lively but their practice sessions resemble a three-ring circus. On the gym floor the flag line is getting instruction in marching routines. In another spot, a half dozen rifle carriers practice throwing their rifles high into the air, each gaining maximum height together and each returning into the hands of the boy at the same precise moment. All by himself, the captain practices sending his 24-inch sabre 30 feet up and catching it without breaking his stride. Oblivious to all this activity, managers are pacing off the exact dimensions of the floor (40' x 60') and placing posting standards at proper intervals to receive the flag poles during the show.

The fact that all these seemingly uncoordinated groups are eventually brought together into an effective drill team is a tribute to the drive and sustained effort of the boys.

The Aquinas effort paid off in Kenmore, culminating months of practice and lesser competitions. Jim Allen, Aquinas' commander, walked off with the best leader trophy. The team won the right to carry the coveted championship flag in all parades and also received the championship cup. Aquinas was also cited for having the best general effect and for the highest marching and maneuvering score.

As for the future, according to director Father John Whitley, the guard will compete for the American Legion State title in Syracuse July 27.

Buerkle May Be Big Track Star

An Aquinas Institute graduate of 1965 just may become one of the nation's top distance runners next season.

Dick Buerkle, a Villanova junior and a top athlete while at Aquinas, was just a stride behind Pittsburgh's ace, Jerry Richey, who took the two-mile run at the Penn Relays in Philadelphia last Sunday. Richey's 8:46.3 time was only a fraction faster than Buerkle's. Villanova took four Penn Relays events in the annual carnival.

Buerkle is certain to lead Villanova next year as the Wildcats look for another national collegiate indoor championship. He established the Aquinas record for the mile run in 1965, covering the distance in 4 minutes, 28.3 seconds.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Buerkle of 52 Hurstbourne Road, Dick is a member of St. James parish. His younger brother, Joe, is a sophomore at Aquinas and a member of the school's track team.

Kearney Trackmen Win 2 Meets

The Bishop Kearney track team beat East 81-37, and Franklin 99-14 1/2 to run their record to 3-0.

Against East Mike Leonard (22-6) and Jim Erbeling (22-8) took 1st and 2nd in the 180 low hurdles. In the Triple Jump, Born (37-3) took 1st. High Jump was won by Dan Howland (5-4).

In the 400, Keegan (56-0) took 2nd. Dan Howland won the 220, with time of 26.1. Jim Erbeling (11-4) captured the 100.

Tom Aman (4:45.2) won the mile. In the 2-mile medley, Jeff Eichen, Nick Habes and Pat Gotell won with a time of 10:55. Muir (58-5), D'Arrienza (1:25), Howland (1:49), Habes (4:03-6) won the mile medley.

Kearney swept the Shot Put with Haefner (45-7 1/2), Cirrito (41-8 1/2), and Forte (35-9 1/2). Against Franklin, in the Long Jump, Born took 1st (19-2) and Mazza (18-3 1/2) took 2nd. In the Triple Jump, Keegan (38-2) took 2nd. Bob Wahl (9-0) won the Pole Vault. Dan Howland (5-4) won the High Jump.

Kearney swept the Shot Put with Haefner (49-4), Shales (45-2), and Cirrito (44-10). John Aman; Masa, DePasquale, Sanger won the one-mile medley with time of 4:23.4. Nick Habes (10:54), D'Errico (11:00), and Urlacher (11:09-9) swept the 2-mile. In the 220, Howland (26) took 2nd. Erbeling (26), Germano (26-9), Wahl (25) and Howland (2:59) took the 880 relay with a time of 1:44. In the 880, King runners took 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th: Volan (2:13), Maley (2:17-1), Goodman (2:19-4), and McKenna (2:25-6). In the 440: Habza (59-2) won.

Erbeling won the 100 yd dash. Steve D'Arrienza (10-8) took 2nd.

Nazareth Music Groups Set Spring Concert

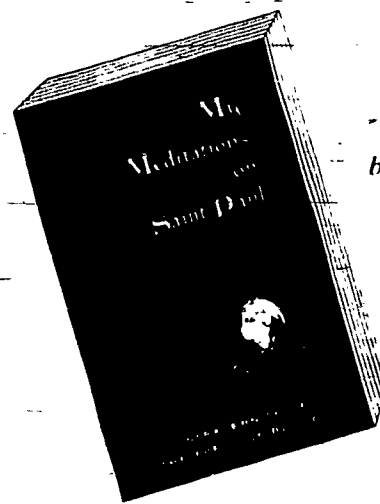
The Nazareth Academy music department will present a concert Friday, May 17, at 8:15 p.m. in the school auditorium.
