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McQuaid Schedules 'Inner City' School

Forty inner city boys won't be roaming the streets this summer with nothing to do.

Instead, they'll be on the campus of McQuaid High School in Brighton, participating in a summer school program designed especially for seventh-grade boys. Father Joseph Gersitz, McQuaid principal, announced this week.

The McQuaid program will run six weeks, starting July 1, and center around providing the students with basic instruction in the three Rs, as well as providing individual attention and the opportunity to learn amid new surroundings with an all-male faculty.

There will be six teachers and 15 tutors to work with the boys in a full day's program, from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

At last count 16 schools had responded with recommendations of students for the summer school.

The McQuaid program, the

first of its kind among Catholic high schools in Monroe County, is patterned after the Higher Achievement Program conducted by the Jesuits in New York City.

The Rochester program will be partially financed by the New York State Province of the Jesuits. In addition, private funds will be sought locally to make up the \$5,000 needed to run the program.

Father Gersitz said that he was "amazed" at the quick response of the 16 schools. Applications had been sent to 22 inner city schools, and open enrollment schools, three responding that they had no students qualified for the program.

He added that he expects to eventually receive about 80 applications for the 40 places. "The program is designed to instill a respect for learning in the boys and motivate them to achieve their potential. We hope they'll be able to take this back to their schools in the fall," Father Gersitz said.

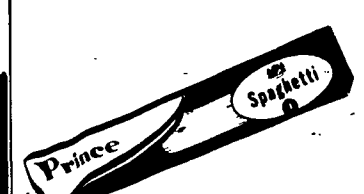
Season Opens For Playhouse

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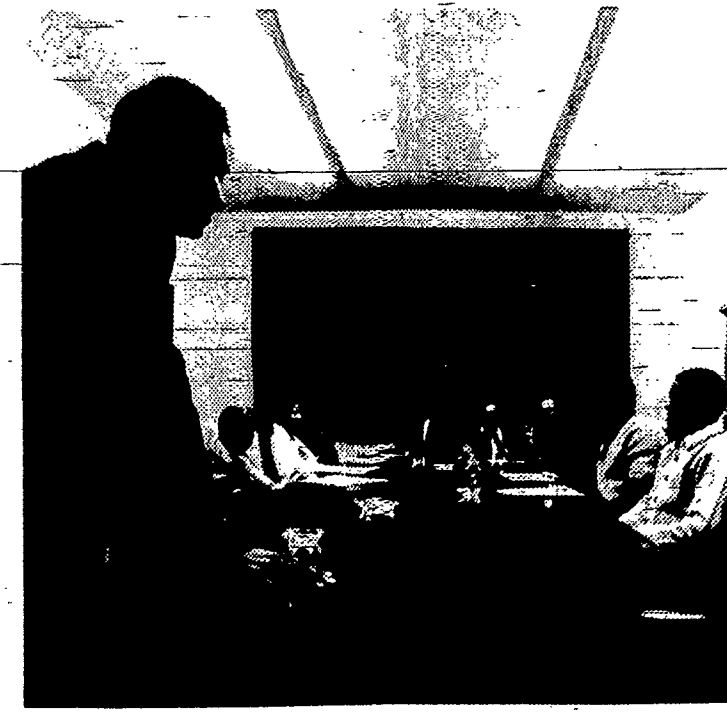

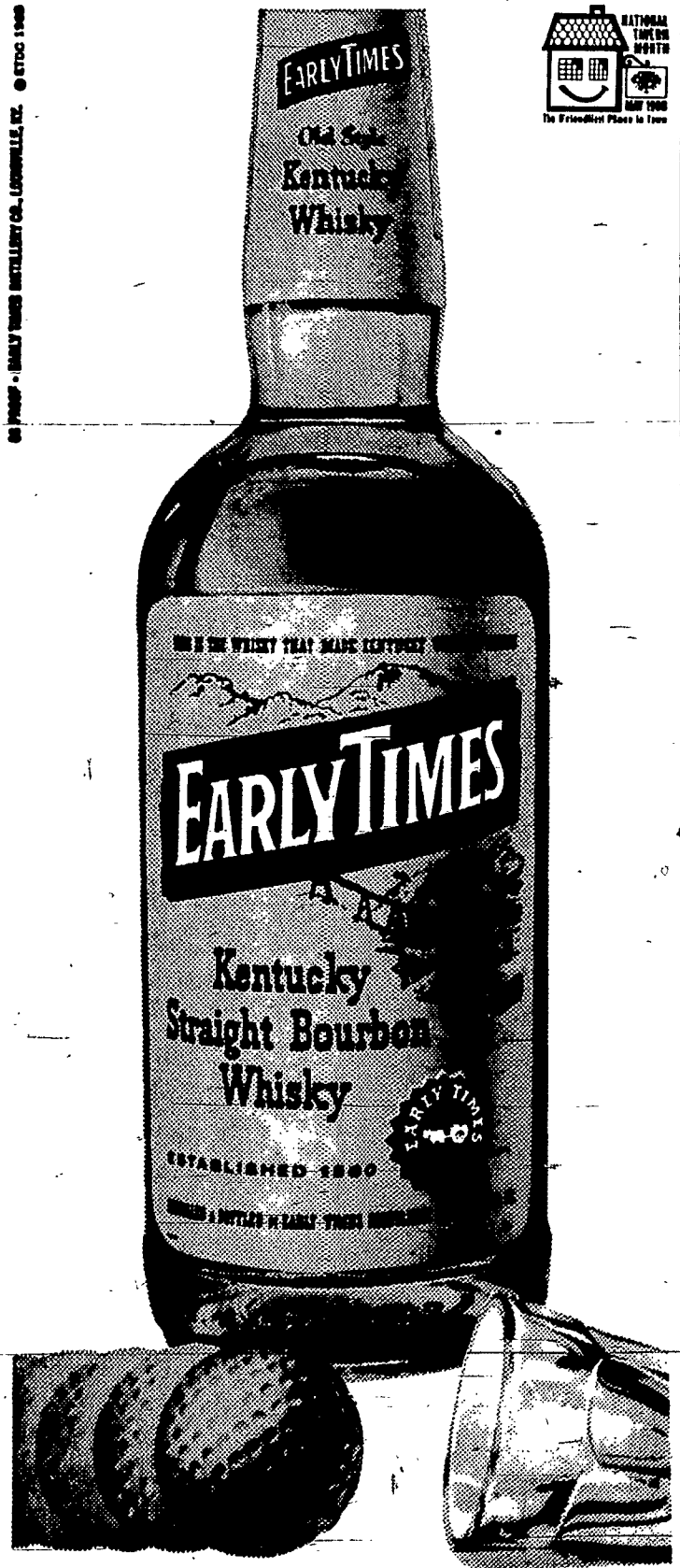
