2 More Parishes Join Trend To Establishing Lay Council

Two more Rochester area parishes are joining the parish council movement, with parish conventions geared to provide a greater role for lay responsibility.

St. James Church in Irondequoit held a three-night convention this week (May 20-22) in their parish hall. St. Francis Xavier Church in Rochester is scheduled for a similar session on Sunday afternoon and Monday evening (May 25-27) next week.

Both conventions represent the culmination of several months of researching the goals and resources of the respective parishes. Both will result in the establishing of parish councils which will take their full role in the parish apostolate.

St. James' convention had separate sessions on liturgy, education, finance, youth and community relations. William McNichols was convention chairman. The closing evening also included a discussion of a proposed constitution.

Holy Family Church in Rochester set a pattern for later parish council efforts when it set up its own last year. The plan included several months of researching the parish and polling parishioners before a full scale convention at which a constitution was drawn up and officers elected.

Northwest Clergy Sponsor Classes On Race Problem

A course of instruction centered on "the grave problem of racism" has begun at three churches of the northwest section of the city.

Sponsored by the Northwest Clergy Association and the Northwest Interfaith Lay Committee on Racial Justice, the course is planned for six meetings during May and June at each of the following: Dewey Avenue Presbyterian Church, Sunday evenings; Sacred Heart School, Tuesday evenings; and Holy Apostles school, Thursday evenings. All classes will begin at 8 p.m.

Laymen and clergy in the neighborhoods will be assisted in teaching by representatives of the black community. Topics range through "Black American History" and the civil rights movement to specific current issues and suggested solutions.

The course is for those who question the "status" of the civil rights movement and the "involvement" of churches, as well as those who want to find out what they can do, the sponsors announced.

Preschool Religion Workshop Topic

A workshop for preschool religion teachers will be held from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. tomorrow (May 25) at St. Lawrence School, 1011 N. Greece Rd. More than 100 persons have registered.

Speakers will be Sister Eugenia and Sister Rosalia, director of Trinity Montessori School. There will be workshops in creative arts, program organization and classroom techniques.

Bishop McCafferty Talks to K of C Unit

Auxiliary Bishop John E. McCafferty was guest speaker at the Gleason Works Knights of Columbus meeting at the Country House in East Rochester.

Bishop McCafferty, who said it was his first talk to a K of C group since becoming auxiliary bishop, discussed the ecumenical movement.

Mercy Sisters End Renewal Sessions

The Sisters of Mercy concluded a year-long series of community gatherings aimed at seeking renewal through educational sharing with religious from other communities on May 18 with an all-day session studying "The Person in Community."

Guest speakers Father John Evey, S.J. from Gonzaga College, Spokane and Sister Maureen O'Keefe, SND, Newman Counselor, marked the last in a long line of experts from many fields to take part in the program. Others involved in the past year have included professionals from the fields of music, theology and education.

The series has included the following speakers: Father Marcel Rooney, OSB, a Professor in Theology and Liturgical Music at Conception Abbey, Missouri; Father Rene Chabot, a La Salette Father, theologian and former Novice Master; Dr. Gloria Joseph, Assistant Dean of Students, Cornell University; Father Walter Principe, CSB, theologian from the University of Toronto; Msgr. William Roche, Rochester Diocesan Superintendent of Schools; and Father Paul Boyle, CP, Executive Coordinator for the Canon Law Society of America, and the United States Bishop appointee for Canon Law revision in the light of Vatican II.
