**Harvard Prof. To Head Catholic School Study**

New York—(RNS)—Dr. Robert B. Binswanger, a top educator from Harvard, has been named to supervise the study of the Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of New York.

The announcement of his appointment was made by T. Murray McDonnell, chairman of the 16-member Committee on Catholic Education established in April by Archbishop Terence J. Cooke.

The non-sectarian unit consisting of outstanding educators and civic leaders of all faiths is the first of its kind. It will study one of the world's largest non-public educational systems.

Dr. Binswanger, 37-year-old assistant professor of education at Harvard, is also director of the Advanced Administrative Institute and research associate for the Center for Studies in Education and Development there.

A graduate of Dartmouth College, Dr. Binswanger was awarded a master's degree and doctorate from the Graduate School of Education at Harvard.

Dr. Binswanger was a participant in the Washington symposium on Catholic education which was conducted in the fall by the National Catholic Educational Association. He has also been a member or a consultant to the following:

- East Fore for the development of the Human Resources Administration, the National Council for the Early Years, School for the Future, Inc., in New York City, Advisory Committee for ABC (A Better Chance), Office of Economic Opportunity—VISTA—National Teachers Corps, and the Boards of Education in Detroit, Milwaukee, Cleveland, Philadelphia, and New Orleans.

**Fordham Seeks To Clarify Its Legal Status**

New York—(RNS)—The legal status of church-related colleges and universities will be the subject of a study at Fordham University.

The question is according to Father Leo McLaughlin, S.J., Fordham president, "What must Fordham do to achieve parity before the law with non-sectarian universities?"

"The financial crisis in private higher education is very real," Father McLaughlin noted. "In its recent report, the Select Committee on the Future of Private and Independent Higher Education in New York State recommended direct assistance by the state to private colleges and universities, including church-related ones."

Father McLaughlin said that if church-related schools are to share in any assistance, their legal status must be clarified.

Fordham University is an example of how state aid was withheld because of its religious affiliation. Last fall, Professor Marshall McLuhan, the Canadian communications theorist, was named to the state-supported Albert Schweitzer Chair in the Humanities at Fordham. Attorney General Louis Lefkowitz rejected the contract, saying that the appointment was unconstitutional because it would tend "to enhance the general reputation" of Fordham.

In past court and legal opinions, scholarships and other government aid made directly to students, even those at church-related institutions, were termed legal. Assistance made directly to an institution has been labeled a violation of the separation of church and state.

**St. John Fisher To Graduate Largest Class**

The largest graduating class in the history of St. John Fisher College will receive degrees at the 14th Commencement Exercises to be held in the Fisher Athletic Center Sunday, June 2, at 3 p.m.

With 246 degree candidates, the Fisher Class of '68 is almost a hundred larger than last year's previous high of 138 graduates.

Ambassador Sol M. Lowitz, United States representative to the Organization of American States and former chairman of the board of Xerox Corp., will be the commencement speaker. He will be awarded an honorary Doctor of Laws degree.

Bishop Fulton J. Sheen will confer the degrees.
