


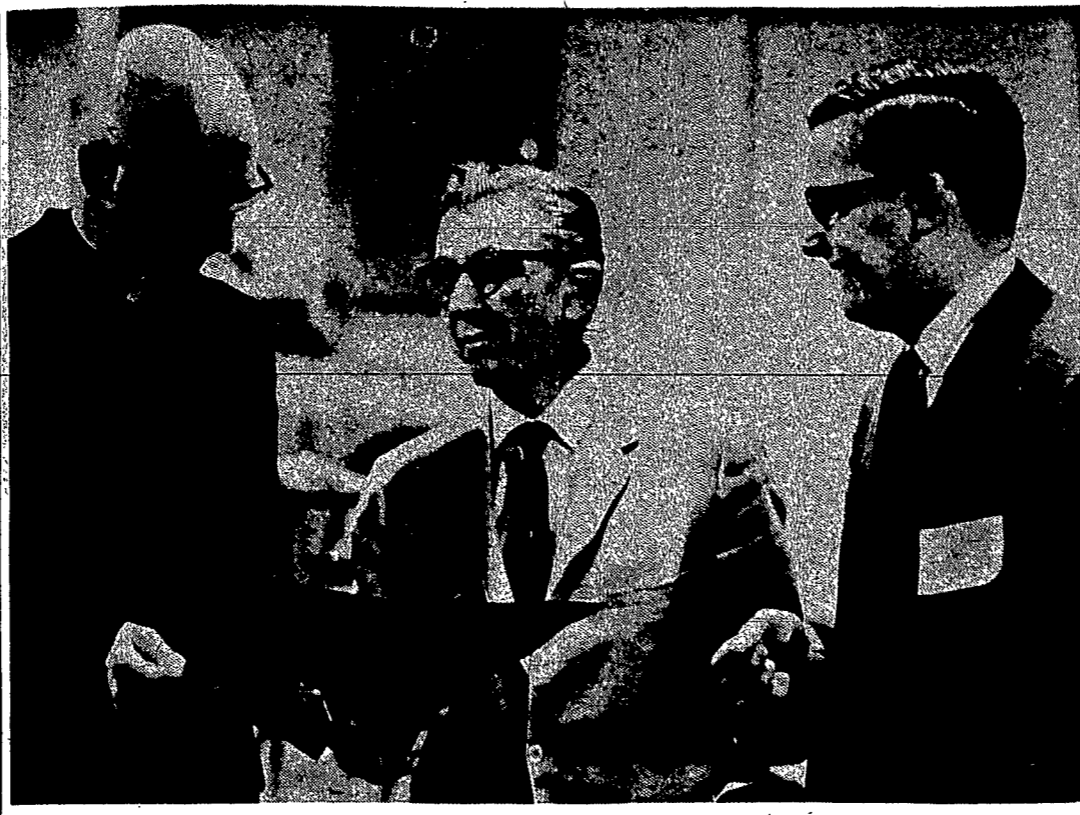

Certain Weeks May Be Combined To Form A 2-Week Encampment

OK of St. James Parishioners To Be Sought for Council

Approval for a proposed parish council will be sought from parishioners of St. James Church in Irondequoit this Sunday (June 9).

A recent three-night parish convention attended by 175 members of the parish moved to establish such a council. Next step, according to William McNichols, who chaired the convention, is to get a consensus of the parish on the proposed council.

If the general parish approval is forthcoming, an election of officers will be held at the St. James parish picnic in July.

A rather unique feature of the preparatory work at this parish was the use of questionnaires to determine what the people saw as the main needs of their parish. More than 800 were returned (of 800 distributed), so that the various interest area committees had some idea of the views of the parishioners.

A temporary steering committee got the ball rolling last February with a study of already existing parish councils in the diocese. This committee reported to the parish in a general meeting in March, asked for people to serve on five committees which would investigate specific areas of interest. The five committees were to study education, liturgy, building and finance, community affairs and youth needs. Three "support" committees (publicity, coordination and convention) were set up to assist the five "investigative" committees.

At the parish convention (May 20-22), in a town meeting atmosphere, the committees reported their findings to the 175 parishioners who attended. Some of the findings included:

- The need for evaluation of religious education, both in the parish school and the CCD program.
- More thorough education regarding changes in the liturgy.
- A need for more youth activities in the parish.
- A desire for more complete information on parish finances.

A committee was established to analyze the various findings of the committees for an overall report to the parishioners.

Father Francis Feeney, pastor of St. James, in his letter inviting his people to the parish convention, reminded them that:

"Vatican II Council has encouraged all members of the family of God to take an active part in the welfare of their church."

Some 70 people served actively on the pre-convention committees. Those heading the five investigative committees were: Education — Arthur Maurer;


