Lyons Reception For Msgr. Neary

Lyons—A reception honoring Monsignor John F. Neary, pastor of St. Michael's Church, will be held at the Lyons Community Center on Sunday, June 9, from 3 to 5 p.m.

Monsignor Neary will retire in June after almost 22 years here. He celebrated his 75th birthday on May 16, and will observe the golden jubilee of his ordination to the priesthood on June 14, 1969.

He came to Lyons in November, 1946. During his pastorate, Monsignor Neary has supervised an extensive program of improvements to the physical plant of the parish. These include the renovation of the church, the building of a parish hall and catechetical center in the church basement, the building of a new garage and parking station in the rear of the church, the surfacing of a parking area on Phelps Street, and many improvements to both the rectory and the convent.

In that time the parish membership has grown to the extent that four Sunday Masses are now required to accommodate the parishioners.

Monsignor Neary is a native of Geneva. He graduated from St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's seminaries in Rochester and is the only surviving member of his 1919 ordination class.

In 1962 he was named a domestic prelate and given the title of Right Reverend Monsignor. Also in that year he was named dean of the Wayne Deanery of the Catholic Diocese of Rochester.

During his retirement Monsignor Neary will be in residence at St. Ambrose Rectory, 25 Empire Boulevard, Rochester.

Sisters to Teach In Public School

Minneapolis—(RNS)—Sister Ireneau, C.S.J., is an English teacher at Holy Angels Academy, a Roman Catholic girls' school here.

Next year, she will be Miss Maireen Mashek, an English teacher at Central High School, Minneapolis—the first nun to be hired by the city's public school system. She will not wear religious dress.

According to Nathaniel Ober, assistant superintendent for secondary education: "We really wanted her because she's an outstanding teacher."

"I've received much encouragement and nothing but a generous response from my community, the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet," she said. She and five other Sisters now live in a house near downtown Minneapolis instead of a convent.

Sister Ireneau, a teacher 14 years, has taught English, speech and drama. She will teach sophomore English at Central High and coach student actors in a school play.
