

# Udall Urges Your Help in Expanding Recreational Facilities

I believe we have entered an age of wisdom in conservation. Despite, or perhaps because of, seemingly overwhelming odds, both our concepts and our methods have been changing in recent years, becoming more oriented to people's needs and more sophisticated in ways to meet those needs.

Americans are turning to the outdoors in astonishing numbers. The great majority wants facilities for physical activities along with beautiful surroundings and refreshing air and waters.

In terms of participation, outdoor recreation activity in America increased by 50 percent between 1960 and 1965. By 1980 it will jump almost another two-thirds, and by the turn of the century it is expected to be 2½ times greater than it is today.

Concerned Americans  
Many Americans, their numbers also increasing, are intensely concerned with protecting the nation's diminishing, fragile, natural treasures against the destructive invasion of man en masse.

These vital, ever-growing forces have subtly changed the popular meaning of the very term "conservationist." It no longer conjures up the image of a person apart from the populace. Our irrefragable past losses in natural lands and waters through thoughtless neglect have become part of the total national consciousness.

This, together with the problems of the present, and our dreams for environmental excellence in the future, is making conservationists of us all.

The traditional schism, between the urbanite and the ruralist, the gregarious outdoorsman and the wilderness buff, keeps narrowing. Even our most dedicated indoorsmen are unable to ignore the health hazards of inadequate open space and air and water pollution control, are becoming involved in conservation issues.

A New Dimension  
We are learning as a people what some far-sighted individuals have long known—that with limited outdoor resources and multiple growing needs, we must engage in a "best-use"

policy of land management if we are to survive as a healthy and beautiful nation.

This "new dimension" in conservation calls for a partnership of federal, state, local and private action to improve the total environment of all.

One of the most effective tools for welding this partnership has been the Land and Water Conservation Fund, established in the Department of the Interior in 1965, and administered by the Bureau of Outdoor Recreation.

The fund is used exclusively for conservation-recreation needs — to acquire needed Federal recreation lands and

waters for the National Park Service, the Forest Service, and the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife, and to help States, through matching grants, to buy and develop state and local recreation areas.

By June 30, 1967, the federal agencies had acquired some

225,000 acres of recreation lands at a cost of approximately \$66 million from the fund; by December 31, 1967, states and Territories had received a total of about \$18.5 million for more than 2,100 individual acquisition and development projects ranging from neighborhood playgrounds and trails to state parks.

All of these actions express the will of the people. They have promoted and supported, with money and votes, these federal, state, and local programs.

We must surpass this record in the coming years if we are to meet the need for increased

outdoor recreation opportunities.

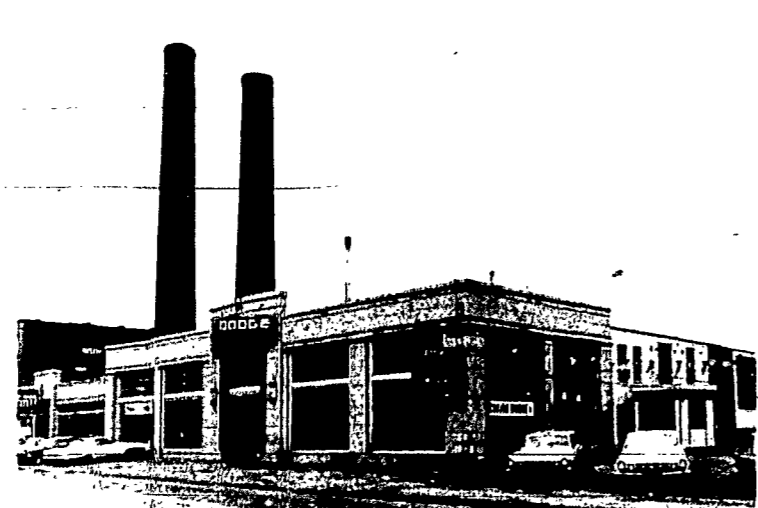
On the federal list of "musts" are lands to be acquired for recently authorized areas . . . the Delaware Water Gap and the Whiskeytown-Shastatain National Recreation Areas in Pennsylvania and California; Assateague Island Na-

tional Seashore in Maryland and Virginia; Cape Lookout National Seashore in North Carolina; Pictured Rocks National Lakeshore and Indiana Dunes National Lakeshore in Michigan and Indiana; Guadalupe Mountains National Park in Texas, and the San Juan Island National Historic Park in Washington. There will be more.

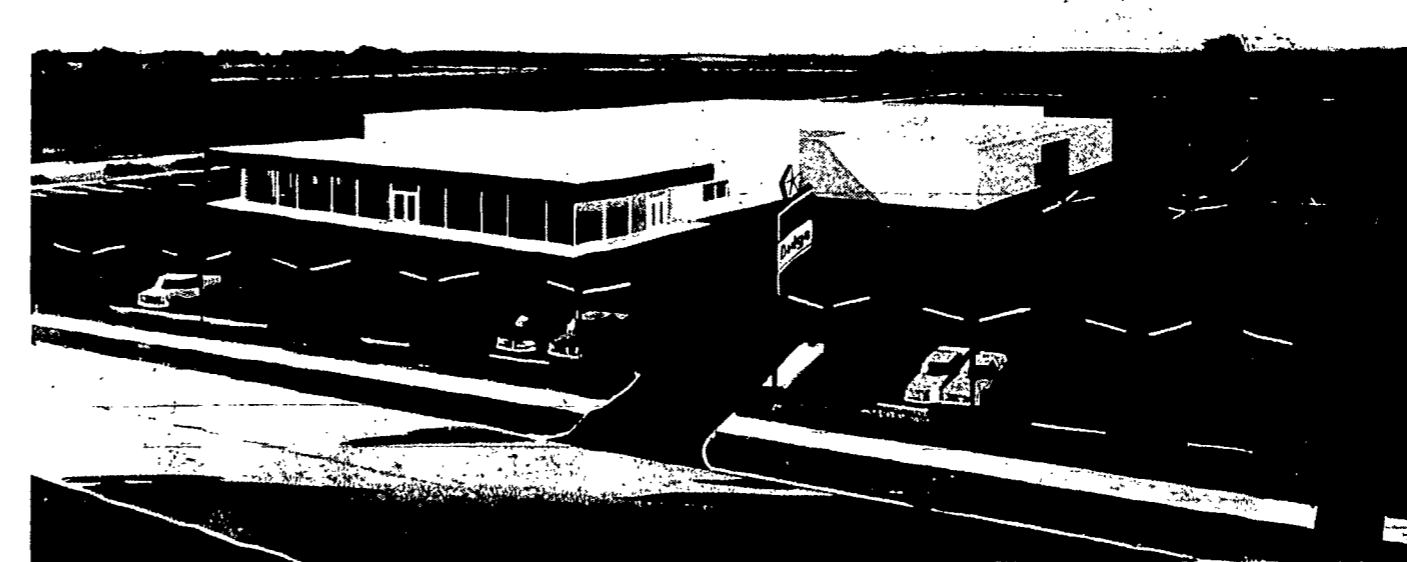
