2 Faiths OK Steps For Chinese Bible

Hong Kong — (NC) — Three major steps toward publication of a common Catholic-Protestant Bible in Chinese have been agreed upon by the Catholic and Protestant Bibles Societies of Hong Kong.

The plan for an active biblical apostolate to overcome long established differences between the Catholic and Protestant translations in Chinese will begin with the celebration of a joint biblical Sunday each year, the exchange sale of Catholic and Bible Society testaments in religious bookstores, and initiation of informal scholarly discussions on a common Chinese scriptural terminology.

Lutheran Leader Dies
 New Rochelle — (NC) — Just a week after his resignation for health reasons as president of the Lutheran Church in America, the Rev. Dr. Franklin Clark Fry, 67, died (June 6) here of cancer. He held the office of national president for six years. Prior to that, from 1957 to 1963, he was president of the 72-million-member Lutheran World Federation.

Rochester Buffalo, All-Catholic

The Rochester diocesan track and field team captured 11th place in the All-Catholic Intersectional meet at Rochester, N.Y., Sunday.

Paced by four places from 114 points to Buffalo's 83 at Syracuse's 30, Bishop Kearney and Aquinas contributed to first places each to the victors.

Five meet records were Kearney's Tom Arnan established a new mark in the 100-yard dash, Doug Whelan of Tonawanda's Cardinal O'Hara had a record 10.0 but then he was defeated by Tom Rapp's 10.1. Whelan then defeated Rapp in the 220 yard relay record of 22.0.

A near-perfect season in sport usually produces a bumper crop of records, and recently concluded track and field season at McQuaid Jesuit High was no exception. Nine new standards were set and tenth mark tied as the Knights posted a 14-1 record in dual and triangular meets, as well as championships in the diocesan meet and multi-school meets at Hornell, Elmira, and the Aquinas Relays.

McQuaid Have Best

Latest record-breaker was senior Dave Gaudino, whose 1.17 in the 180-yd. low hurdle was one of four firsts McQuaid provided in the Rochester schools' All-Catholic Intersectional victory over Buffalo at Syracuse last Sunday.

Gaudino, in his first season without an injury, also led-off on McQuaid's record-breaking shuttle hurdles (55.9) and third leg on the 8 yd. relay team which lowered the school record to 1:33. Joining him on the former quartet were seniors Bob DiPaola and Greg Walsh and Jun. Rick Stone. The latter team completed by senior Bob C. junior Mark Welt, and sophomore Mike Pignato.

DiPaola and Welt also individual laurels, DiPaola tending his own long jump mark to 21-9 and Welt setting new scoring high of 19 points in 16 meets.
