## Rochester Diocese Defeats Buffalo, Syracuse to Win All-Catholic Track Crown

The Rochester diocesan track and field team captured the championship of the All-Catholic Intersectional meet at RIT Sunday.

Paced by four places from 114 points to Buffalo's 83 and Syracuse's 30, Bishop Kearney and Aquinas contributed two first places each to the victory.

Five meet records were set. Kearney's Tom Aman established a new mark in the 880 with a time of 1:57.2. McQuaid's Dave Gaudino posted a time of 19.7 in the 180-yard low hurdles and Tom Ryan of Niagara Falls' Bishop Duffy tossed the discus a record 146 feet, 1 inch.

In a qualifying heat for the 100-yard dash, Doug Whelan of Tonawanda's Cardinal O'Hara had a record 10.0 but then lost to Aquinas' Tom Rapp's 10.1. Whelan then defeated Rapp in the 220 tying the record time of 22.0.

McQuaid set the fifth meet mark with a 3:40.4 in the mile medley, beating Buffalo's Bishop Timon by a scant margin.

Another record was tied by McQuaid relay runners when they did the 880 in 1:33.1.

Bill Pinakiewicz of Bishop Timon was the meet's only double winner capturing first in the long and triple jumps.

## McQuaid Trackmen Have Best Season

A near-perfect season in any sport usually produces a bumper crop of records, and the recently concluded track and field season at McQuaid Jesuit High was no exception. Nine new standards were set and a tenth mark tied as the Knights posted a 14-1 record in dual and triangular meets, as well as championships in the diocesan meet and multi-school meets at Hornell, Elmira, and the Aquinas Relays.

Latest record-breaker was senior Dave Gaudino, whose 19.7 win in the 180-yd. low hurdles was one of four firsts McQuaid provided in the Rochester schools' All-Catholic Intersectional victory over Buffalo and Syracuse last Sunday.

Gaudino, in his first season without an injury, also ran lead-off on McQuaid's record-breaking shuttle hurdles team (55.9) and third leg on the 880-yd. relay team which lowered the school record to 1:32.7. Joining him on the former quartet were seniors Bob DiPaola and Greg Walsh and junior Rick Stone. The latter team was completed by senior Bob Carr, junior Mark Welt, and sophomore Mike Pignato.

DiPaola and Welt also had individual laurels, DiPaola extending his own long jump mark to 219 and Welt setting a new scoring high of 136 1/2 points in 16 meets.

The school record in the quarter was broken twice, first by sophomore Al Bredekamp with a 52.0 and three weeks later by junior Mark Weider with a 51.9. The discus mark was broken twice by the same thrower—senior Bert Pehrenbuch—who left it finally at 138-1. A sixth individual record fell to junior Greg Moss with a 42-7 triple jump.

The third relay mark was accounted for by the Knights' four-mile relay team of Dean Stanley, Ed Robertson, Phil Horton, and Bob Wafer, who clocked 19:19.4 at Elmira.

Sharing laurels with the record-breakers were the two winners of McQuaid's "Most Improved" awards. Senior Carl Fimmano, a 2:06 half-miler, took the award for running, while sophomore Art DiAntonio, diocesan J.V. champion in the long and triple jumps, won in field events.
