A Warning Pool Owners:

The County Health Department and the County Public Safety Laboratory warn swimming pool owners never to put chlorine tablets in brominators, which are devices used to disinfect the water of many pools.

"Only promine should be used in brominators. If chlorine is placed into them it may cause a chemical reaction and explosion," said James Lanigan, senior public health sanitarian at the Health Department, and John Temmerman, director of the Public Safety Laboratory.

The joint warning was prompted by a recent incident in which a swimming pool brominator blew up after chlorine was put into it. If persons had been near the device at the time, they could have suffered serious
