Propriety of TV Mass Questioned

Ottawa, Can. — An important Protestant clergyman has questioned whether it is proper for churches to broadcast their liturgies on radio and television.

The re-assessment of liturgical broadcasts by Catholics, Protestant and Orthodox churches was called for by the Rev. Albert H. van den Heuvel in the latest issue of "Christian Communications," published by the St. Paul University School of Communications in Ottawa.

Dr. van den Heuvel, who is director of information for the World Council of Churches, lived several arguments against broadcasting the liturgy that he said have either been overlooked or ignored by the churches in their zeal to reach agnostics, the uncommitted, the fallen-aways or the shut-ins via radio and TV.

"It seems to me that the recurring theme of the Constitution is clear," Dr. van den Heuvel declared. "Renewal of the liturgy means a single-minded concentration against participation of those present and an avoidance of all that could lead to a perversion of the liturgy as an activity of the ordained, in which the faithful are mere spectators."

"A famous argument is always about the sick and lonely people, the people at home, who thanks to radio and television can now participate in the worship of the congregation," he said. "But the Constitution of the Liturgy says no such thing. They can watch the liturgy, but they cannot participate. They can be spectators. But they cannot be participants."

The minister also believes that "the broadcast of public worship on the public media does little to foster a reverent attitude to liturgical activity" — with many people drinking coffee, joking or reading comics while the liturgy is on radio or TV. "The liturgy for all purposes becomes comparable to background music during breakfast."

"At rare instances," he noted, "a whole country or a continent, even the whole world, can become a single congregation. In such moments there is an anticipation of the new Jerusalem, if you will, with all the people finding themselves willing to pray with the Church, even those who do not believe in God."

He mentioned as such instances requiem services for men like Canada's Governor-General Georges Vanier, President Kennedy, Martin Luther King and Sen. Robert F. Kennedy.

"These are tremendous moments, and at such times the Church can say, with its hand on the Constitution of the Liturgy: Now is the time! When such a thing happens, then we have news for the world."

New York (RNS) — "Rosemary's Baby," a film version of the popular novel about witchcraft and devil worship in present-day New York City, has been "condemned" by the National Catholic Office for Motion Pictures.
In placing the film in the "C" category, NCOMP said "Because of several scenes of nudity this contemporary horror study about devil worship would qualify for a condemned rating."
"Much more serious, however is the perverted use which the film makes of fundamental Christian beliefs, especially in the events surrounding the birth of Christ, and its mockery of religious persons and practices. The very technical excellence of the film serves to intensify its defamatory nature."
