
Liturgist Offers Views Against Intercommunion

Detroit (NC) - A leadin Catholic liturgist told a nation interfaith audience here th Holy Communion is the prima sign of the acceptance Church audthority, and is then fore not to be extended to Pro estants except under exception conditions.

In what was considered l many Catholic and Protesta ecumenists in the audience be a highly conservative pos tion, Father Godfrey Diekman O.S.B., told the fifth Nation Workshop for Christian Uni that even intercommunion wi the Eastern Orthodox cannot practiced without "satisfacto" consultations with compete authorities" on both sides.

Protestants themselves a split widely on the question, l said, and study papers prepare for the coming general asser bly of the World Council Uppsala, Sweden, present sin lar differences of opinio among the Protestant-Orthodo churches.

| 2 tsp. baking powder                                  |
| 1 tsp. salt   |
| 2 tsp. sugar  |
| 1/2 cup shortening                                    |
| Canned or fresh fruit sliced-prune, apple, peach, etc |

Mix all ingredients except fruit and add a few drops of milk until dough holds together like pie crust. Roll out and fit in 11x7 pan. Arrange fruit in regular layers on top. Mix together the following and spread evenly over fruit:

Bake at 350F about 25 minutes or until lightly browned.


