Female Priesthood? No, Says Survey Of Catholic Women

New York—(RNS)—Most Catholic women oppose ordaining women to the priesthood—rate—communication between laity and parish priests as fair to poor, according to a survey released here.

Married men (65 per cent) and single women (67 per cent) were most in favor of optional celibacy.

In evaluating communication between parish priests and laity only 3 per cent of the women thought it was excellent, 13 per cent good, 34 per cent fair, and 30 per cent poor.

Bishops fared even worse at the hands of the women who rated their communication with the faithful—2 per cent said excellent, 6 per cent good, 15 per cent fair, and 50 per cent poor.

In response to questions on the Church's teaching on birth control (this part of the survey was asked only of women) 83 per cent said the Church could change its teaching; 59 per cent thought the Church should change its teaching; but only 43 per cent expected the Church to change.

The survey was based on a lengthy questionnaire sent to 1,576 persons and tabulated at the Fordham University Computer Processing Center.

In answer to the question, "Should Women Be Priests?" 53 per cent of the respondents replied no to 31 per cent yes. However, 64 per cent of the nuns responded negatively to this question as compared to 54 per cent of the single women and 55 per cent of the married women.

It is also interesting to note that 48 per cent of the married men favored women priests as compared to 32 per cent of their wives and 23 per cent of the priests queried.

Nuns recorded the highest opposition to making celibacy optional for priests, with 32 per cent saying no and 33 per cent yes. However, 55 per cent of the priests favored optional celibacy with only 22 per cent

Fruit Kuchen

- 2 cups flour
- 2 tsp. baking powder
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. sugar
- 1/2 cup shortening
- Canned or fresh fruit sliced—prune, apple, peach, etc.

Mix all ingredients except fruit and add a few drops of milk until dough holds together like pie crust. Roll out and fill in 11x7 pan. Arrange fruit in regular layers on top. Mix together the following and spread evenly over fruit:

Topping

- 1 cup sugar
- 2 tsp. flour
- 2 tsp. cinnamon
- 1/2 cup melted Land O'Lakes Butter
- 1 tbl. water

Bake at 350F about 25 minutes or until lightly browned.

As I See I

Look at 'New

The New American Catholic. Is there one and if so what does he look like?

According to an hour NBC TV documentary produced by Stuart Schulberg and shown this past week on Channel 13 there is definitely a new breed of Catholic in this country.

And you can spot him in any number of ways, find him in somewhat unusual places and hear him mouth ideas that heretofore might have brought down the cry of "heresy" about his head and in some areas of Church thought still may.

In lieu of a moderator or commentator to give the program a much needed coherence, the Most Rev. James P. Shannon, auxiliary bishop of Minneapolis, St. Paul, a frequent church spokesman, served as kind of general observer giving the program what little form and organization it did possess.

Liturgist Offers Views Against Intercommunion

Detroit—(NC)—A leading Catholic liturgist told a national interfaith audience here that Holy Communion is the primary sign of the acceptance of Church authority, and is therefore not to be extended to Protestants except under exceptional conditions.

In what was considered a many Catholic and Protestant ecumenists in the audience, Father Godfrey Diekmann O.S.B., told the fifth National Workshop for Christian Unity that even intercommunion with the Eastern Orthodox cannot be practiced without "satisfactory consultations" with competent authorities" on both sides.

Protestants themselves a split widely on the question, he said, and study papers prepared for the coming general assembly of the World Council of Churches, Uppsala, Sweden, present similar differences of opinion among the Protestant-Orthodox churches.

The Catholic church, he went on, "has been convinced that the Eucharist is meant to be first of all the most important sacrament (or sign) of a unity already achieved among communicants; a unity not of faith in the presence of under the appearances of bread and wine, but a unity of full belonging to this visible Church of accepting this visible Church as the authoritative teacher of faith, of accepting the authority and leadership of her duly constituted and ordained ministers."

He said unfortunately "it seems to be back to where we were prior to Vatican II, except for prayer in common."
