Two Auburn parishes have unique ways of reporting on collections: as part of its bulletin one prints in several mimeo pages every Sunday the total list of donors and their gifts over \$1 from the previous week.

The other church uses red paper for its bulletin every week that the Sunday collection has not reached the announced minimum total needed for parish stability. When the parishioners see their bulletin on white paper, (too rare_a_sight,_some_admit), they know that last week's figures pleased the finance committee.

Glaringly absent from bulletins is news on how parochial funds are being used from week to week, or even season to season. An annual financial statement seems to be considered an adequate 🗏 accounting of the pastor's stewardship.

Yet many laymen who face the monthly duty of paying bills and balancing their own finances believe that a precise monthly listing of all the specific, major disbursements required for parish maintenance would be an easy bulletin gesture.

Telling the donor where his dollars went would help make parishioners observant of the parish property and programs and give them a sense of sharing parishioners say. Not everyone can be on the finance committee, laymen admit, but "it's human nature to give better when you know where it's going."

Charity done by the parish seems to be a legitimate item of bulletin material but hardly-anywhere is it publicized for the parishioners. An annual visiting missionary finds its easy to beg from even the less-affluent parishes, but if the parish-treasury is aiding the local poor, or could do so, bulletins never report.

Two campus communities, the Catholic students at Cornell University and at Ithaca College, have for several years tithed for the poor each Sunday, taking a straight 10 per cent of the weekly offering and sending it to needy groups in the U.S. and abroad. Students are invited to suggest to the chaplains where the tithe should be sent.
