They Want Their School

Elmira—Parishioners at St. Patrick's by a 2-1 margin voted against partitioning Bishop Sheen to close off the parish school's seventh and eighth grades. By an overwhelming 6-1 vote they declared themselves in favor of entering into educational partnership with St. Anthony's to establish a central Catholic junior high school. In giving the laity the unusual opportunity of expressing its views on the operation of its school, the church was disappointed by the small turnout of 40 per cent of eligible parishioners.

Father Curran to Be Summer Lecturer At St. Bonaventure

St. Bonaventure, N.Y.—The Rev. Charles Curran of Catholic University, Washington, D.C., a leading moral theologian in the country, is giving a series of lectures at St. Bonaventure University's Summer School. The lectures, sponsored by the University's Department of Sacred Science, begin at 8 p.m. in the University Center. Dates and themes of the remaining lectures: Wednesday and Thursday, July 17 and 18, "The Sacrament of Penance"; Wednesday, July 24, "Moral Theology and the Law," and Thursday, July 25, "Moral Theology and the Magisterium." Father Curran, newly elected president of the Catholic Theological Society of America, has participated in numerous symposia, workshops, and institutes in the United States and Canada. He has written extensively for theological and popular publications. He is the author of "Christian Morality Today," "Absolute in Moral Theology," and his latest to be published in September, "New Look at Christian Morality." Father Curran is a priest of the Rochester Diocese. He was educated at St. Bernard's and at the Gregorian University in Rome, Italy, where he received his doctoral degree. He also received a doctorate in theology with a specialization in moral problems from the Academia Alfonsiana in Rome.

Plea to Businessmen Raises \$210,000 for Joliet Parish School

Joliet, Ill.—(RNS)—The Roman Catholic Diocese of Joliet has raised approximately \$210,000 from private industry, business, and individuals for support of its diocesan high schools. Father Niles J. Gillen, O. Carm., diocesan superintendent of schools, in revealing this pledged figure, maintained that the fund drive holds broad implications for the future of non-public education in the United States. "The problem, basically," Father Gillen said, "is that the Catholic Church can no longer underwrite the operation of its high schools, which like their public counterparts, have been hit rather severely by rising costs." Father Gillen has a five-year goal of \$3,875,000. He is asking business, industry and concerned individuals to give \$100 annually for each Catholic high school student.
