Mohawk Indians from the Caughnawaga Reservation near Montreal will make their annual pilgrimage this Sunday to the Shrine of the North American Martyrs at Auriesville.

Thirty of them in traditional garb will sing the noon Mass in the Iroquois language. Mohawk chiefs in full regalia will accompany the priest carrying the Blessed Sacrament in an afternoon procession into the ravine, where St. Rene Goupil, the first canonized victim of their ancestors, was buried.

Our POP cooks are really on the ball these days, continuing to share with us some of their family recipes. That universal favorite, spaghetti sauce, makes the scene today in three entirely different versions. We know you pasta lovers will want to try all of them. The first one came to us from Mrs. Gerald Didas, POP Chairman for the Jennie Rockwell Circle of Bethesda Hospital in Hornell.

Sausage Sauce

1 lb. Maplecrest Sausage cut in pieces
1/4 cup salad oil
1 clove garlic, minced
1 small can Hunt's Tomato Paste
1 large can Hunt's Tomatoes
2 1/2 cups water
2 bay leaves
Salt, pepper and other spices to taste
1/4 tsp. sugar

Brown sausage and pour off fat. Add remaining ingredients. Cover and simmer 1 1/2 to 2 hours. Serve over Prince Macaroni, Spaghetti or Rigatoni. Serves 4-6. (For more servings, double recipe)

Our second sauce recipe was submitted by Mrs. Jean Kuchman, former POP Chairman for St. Augustine's Mothers Club. In the past, we've published other recipes from Mrs. Kuchman and we're pleased that she is continuing her contributions. (She reports, by the way, that this method of making sauce can "stretch" a package of dry mix for more servings.)

Mexitala Spaghetti Sauce

2 lbs. ground beef
1 tbl. quick-cooking oatmeal
2 tbl. salad oil
1 1/2 oz. pkg. dry spaghetti sauce mix
1 1/2 oz. pkg. dry chili mix
1 lb. 12 oz. can Hunt's Tomatoes
1 6 oz. can Hunt's Tomato Paste
1 cup water
1 tbl. sugar

Mix beef with oatmeal and form into balls. Brown in oil, then remove from pan. Stir dry mixes into remaining fat. Add rest of ingredients, stirring constantly. Bring to boil and return meatballs to sauce. Cover and simmer for about 15 minutes. Serve over Prince Spaghetti. Serves 6-8.

For you hardy souls who aren't averse to the chore of old-time canning, Mrs. Kuchman suggests this recipe. True, it does take time and effort, but think of the time and effort saved later. When you want home-made sauce but are in a hurry, just open a can of your own.

Canned Spaghetti Sauce

2 pk. baskets of tomatoes
15 green peppers
4 hot red peppers
15 large onions
3 cloves garlic
10 small cans Hunt's Tomato Paste
1 tsp. red pepper
3 tbl. salt

Cut peeled tomatoes in quarters. Grind together peppers, onions and garlic. Add remaining ingredients and stir well. Bring to a boil and cook slowly 3 to 4 hours. Pour into hot sterilized jars and seal. Makes about 12 quarts.
