### Encyclical Won't Cause Schism, Theologian Tells Priests' Unit

A prominent theologian last week scoffed at the notion that Pope Paul's "Humanae Vitae" encyclical would cause a schism in the Catholic Church.

He noted that this dissent should not be expressed in a manner that weakens the bonds that unites Catholics to the Church, and that due re-

### Bishop Kearney:

## 'The Church Is a Monarchy'

Bishop James E. Kearney celebrated his 84th birthday Monday and took the occasion to point out that the Church does not function as a republic.

"The fact is," he said, "that Christ established the church as a monarchy, with Himself at the head and the administrator on earth as the vicar."

"You can't turn Christ's plan of a monarchy into a republic." The retired bishop addressed a congregation of student nurses, nuns and others at the

Bishop's Mass in the chapel of St. Mary's Hospital.

Calling for loyalty and obedience to Pope Paul VI, he took an analogy from football. The team consists of practiced athletes, "but only one man calls the plays — the quarterback."

Likening the Pope to the quarterback, he said: "We must set aside our own feelings because this man was chosen to make the decisions."

Concerning the storm that centers about the encyclical

Humanae Vitae, the Bishop commented:

"The Holy Father was asked to give an opinion on a very important subject. There was no question of whether it was infallible or not."

Bishop Kearney, 60 years a priest, was celebrating also the 36th anniversary of his consecration. His lifetime has been, he said, "a great experience of what a wonderful thing the loyalty of the human heart has been."

### Irondequoit Parishes Plan New Program Of First Communion

Five parishes in Irondequoit will begin this month a new program of "inter-parish cooperation" — to assist parents in preparation of their children for first Holy Communion.

Cooperating with priests of the parishes of St. Thomas the Apostle, St. Margaret Mary, St. Salome, St. Cecilia and Christ the King will be personnel of the diocesan Confraternity of Christian Doctrine and the director of the diocesan Adult Theology Program.

Parents of these parishes whose children are of age to receive Holy Communion during the coming year may attend either one of two three-Sunday evening lecture and discussion meetings.

Father Leopold Protomastro, OFM Cap., director of the Adult Theology Program, will conduct the lectures on the topic "Adult Understanding of the Eucharist." The meetings, slated from 8 to 9:30 p.m., are scheduled as follows:

Nov. 17, 24 and Dec. 1.—St. Margaret Mary's Church hall.

Jan. 9, 16, 23.—St. Cecilia's Church hall.

Parish priests are expected to attend the lectures and take part in the discussions. Prior meetings are scheduled in parishes to explain the program, and follow-up meetings also have been suggested.

CCD officials expressed the hope that this experiment in inter-parish adult religious education might be a model to be imitated in other diocesan areas.
