Interracial Council In Drive

New members and financial support were sought by the Catholic Interracial Council as it opened its annual membership drive this week.

Expansion of the council's activities during the coming year is the goal of the campaign, according to Paul W. Brayer, president.

The council has been active in the housing problem, he pointed out, and its projects include the CIC Housing Development Corporation and the CIC Housing Corporation. It has joined other groups in support of a scattered-site low-income housing proposal.

It also requested and obtained an investigation by the State Commission for Human Rights into leasing practices in certain apartment developments.

Among other activities listed were the council's presentation of a proposal to the three major faiths to undertake "Project Equality," a means to make "fair housing" practices more effective; participation in grape boycott demonstrations in support of California farm laborers, and a current seminar, "Confrontation: Black and White," which will close a series of six meetings at 7:30 p.m. Sunday, Nov. 10, in St. John the Evangelist's Church hall, Humboldt Street.

Membership dues were listed as: regular, \$5; contributing, \$10; organizational, \$15; sustaining, \$25; life, \$100. Offices are at 205 Edinburgh St.

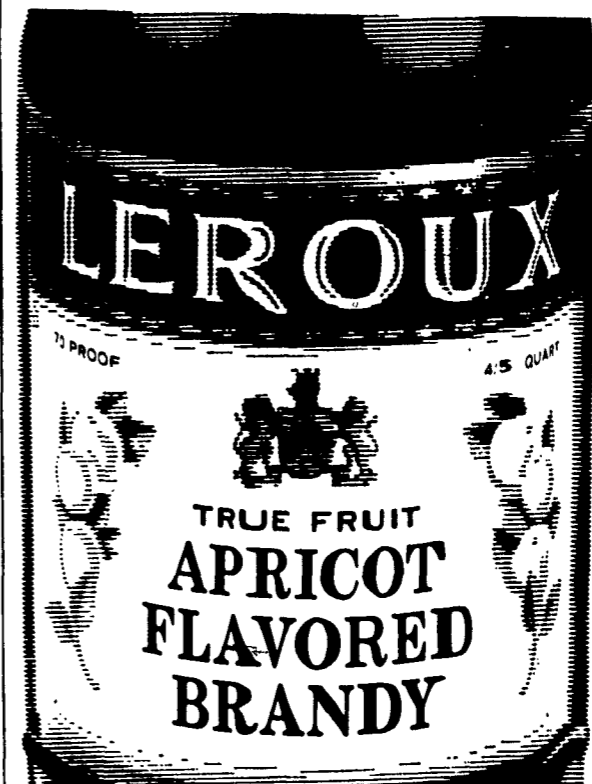
