Four generations in the family—and three of them with the same birthdate—Nov. 12!

Seventy-seven years separate Harry F. Pritchard, 79, and his 2-year-old great-granddaughter, Marjorie Ann.

The clan Pritchard gathered last Sunday at the home of grandson Ronald E. Pritchard, 3352 Brookport-Spencerport Rd., to celebrate the triple Nov. 12 birthdates: Charles F., born Nov. 12, 1889; Ronald, born on the same date in 1943, and Marjorie Ann, Nov. 12, 1966.

Pitchard's daily-wrapped presents gave the living room an "early Christmas" look.

Besides healthy longevity, the near-octogenarian has other distinctions: He has been a pianist for 55 years, and he has a far more-than-average identifica-

tion with his Church and Catholic activities. Among them:

Usher, St. Joseph's Church, Franklin Street, for 19 years; and past president of its Holy Name Society; member, Knights of Columbus Council 178, with citations from its First Friday Luncheon committee and its Catholic Activities committee; member, Notre Dame Retreat League and Nocturnal Adoration Society, with pins from each for more than 10 years in successive attendance; mem-

ber, Knights of St. John, St. Louis Commandery 17; pioneer, the radio Family Rosary for Peace.

Harry Pritchard was the youngest of seven brothers and sisters, all born in Rochester. Only other survivor of these is his sister, Mrs. Lillian Peiffer, 37 Tamarack St. At one time all four of the Pritchard brothers were piano-tuners.

The anniversarian has 21 grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren.
