

# Aquinas Whips Kearney Before 7,000 Spectators

Powered by a tremendous forward wall, Aquinas Institute last Sunday did a business-like job of wrecking Bishop Kearney's hopes of pulling an upset by downing the Kings, 38-0, before nearly 7,000 thoroughly impressed fans at muddy Memorial Stadium.

The Little Irish left little to chance as they pounded six times into touchdown land in spite of a stalwart effort by undermanned Kearney.

The Little Irish line took complete charge of the contest on the slippery Aquinas Stadium turf. Proof of how much Aquinas dominated the play can be gotten from just one statistic: Aquinas reeled off 248 yards rushing and Kearney finished with a minus three yards rushing.

The strains of the well-played National Anthem by the Kearney Band had barely faded away when halfback Bob DiNicola ran the game-opening kickoff 80 yards to score. The speedy junior ripped the Kearney defenses for another six pointer in the third period on an 18-yard run.

Aquinas took a 12-0 edge at halftime, the second touchdown climaxing a 56-yard march led by halfback Mike Skivington, who went over himself from the 1. Skivington struck twice more in the last period on runs of 7 yards and 1 yard.

Gerry Fess accounted for the other touchdown against the King Kings, when quarterback Dan Frank faded back and hit Fess for 37 yards. John Amencio split the uprights with a placement attempt in his usual soccer style kick. Fess collected the other extra point by running around end.

Line play was rough and rugged but as clean as any game this season. In the second half Aquinas chopped the Kearney ground attack without mercy,

dumping the King's luggers for frequent losses.

Bob Rosmarino, Aquinas' mentor for the past four seasons, had praise for all his regulars. From the statistics book John Ferraro and Tim Curtin must have been high up on the coach's list of standouts on defense. Each accounted for a dozen tackles or assists. Dan Frank enjoyed one of his best passing days, gaining 147 yards through the air.
