



### Parish Boundaries Set

The pastoral office defined this week the boundaries of two new parishes, west of Rochester that were established last June. They are north and west of Holy Ghost parish, which dates from 1875. The boundaries are imaginary lines, for the most part, rather than roads. St. Jude's, directly north of Holy Ghost, in Gates, is bounded on the west by Gillette Road. Its southeast corner touches the northeast corner of Holy Ghost at Wegman Road. The intersection of Lyell Ave. and Elmgrove Road gives the area an off-center axis, and the church itself, a renovated barn, is on Elmgrove, across from an Eastman Kodak plant. The northernmost point of the parish is north of Ridgeway near Elmgrove.

North Chili, at the intersection of Buffalo Road and Union Street, and West Chili, at Chili Ave. and Union, are within the area described as St. Christopher's. Across the north, the parish takes in Whittier Road, east to west, from Hutchings to Vroom. The southwest corner is at Bettridge and Chili roads, and the southeast corner, near the intersection of Stottle and Bowen roads.

An irregular imaginary line from Whittier, southeast to Chestnut Ridge, separates St. Christopher from Holy Ghost.

The definition of the new parish areas gives Holy Ghost its first boundaries. For 93 years the parish has been, vaguely, the Coldwater neighborhood. It is established now that, at the east, Holy Ghost takes in nearly the whole length of Pixley Road. Chestnut Ridge Road roughly traces its southern boundary.

Father John Steger, of St. Jude's, and Father Elmer McDonald of St. Christopher's went to work in June, setting up parishes that had not been defined geographically. They started with home Masses, opening their churches for regular Sunday schedules on Aug. 4. The St. Jude congregation recently moved to its barn from the old Elmgrove Methodist Church. The St. Christopher church is in the Medical Center at Union St. and Buffalo Road.

### Vote on Merger Delayed

London—(RNS)—A revised timetable postponing for another two months a final vote on a merger of the Church of England and the Methodist Church was presented to the Convocation of Canterbury here. A similar presentation was made to the York Convocation.

Archbishop Michael Ramsey of Canterbury and Archbishop Donald Coggan proposed the new schedules, and their presentation was made against a backdrop of murmurings of Methodist discontent with the merger plan.

A timetable announced in September 1967 proposed the two Anglican convocations hold their final debate on union and vote in May 1969. The revision proposes that the Anglican Convocation consider the merger next May but not take a final vote until July 1969.

The change would have the vote coincide with the meeting of the Church Assembly (the Anglican parliament) and would allow Anglicans to hear the results of a clergy referendum throughout Great Britain. The referendum will disclose the Anglican clergy's stand on participating in the proposed Service of Reconciliation designed to integrate the two ministries. The form of the service has upset some members of both churches.

Methodists here pointed out that the two Anglican Convocations will take their final vote while the 1968 Methodist Conference is meeting in Birmingham, instead of before it.

The Methodist Conference will take its first vote at the meeting.

### Roy Bush Dies; Political Leader

Roy F. Bush, long-time Democratic leader in Monroe County and recent chairman of the County-Civil Service Commission, died Nov. 16. The funeral was at Blessed Sacrament Church last Tuesday.

Mr. Bush was the father of an assistant pastor at St. Mary's, Father Frederick W. Bush, and of Dr. Mary T. Bush of Nazareth College.

Elected county clerk in 1933 and again in 1936, Mr. Bush became chairman of the Democratic County Committee in 1941, and remained in office until 1954. He served on the County Board of Elections from 1953 until 1957, and on the civil service commission from 1961 until his second term expired last Sept. 30.

Survivors include his widow, Irene Toomey Bush of 485 Rockingham; two sisters, Mrs. James Gleason of this city and Mrs. Donald Leary of Rochester, Minn., and several nieces and nephews.
