# High School Hockey League Formed

Aquinas and McQuaid high schools are included in a newly formed Interscholastic Hockey League which swings into action Saturday, Dec. 21.

In the six-team league, Aquinas, McQuaid and Monroe represent the city high schools, and Brighton, Irondequoit and Fairport the county schools.

Father Cyril Carter, CSB, athletic director at Aquinas and hockey league president, said league games will be played at the new Rochester Institute of Technology rink, Jefferson Road.

Saturday's first game is scheduled at 11:45 a.m., with Irondequoit facing Fairport. Aquinas will square off against Brighton at 1:30 p.m., and McQuaid takes on Monroe at 3 p.m.

Aquinas will be relying on left wing Mike Skivington, who, according to coach Father Jack Spratt, is fast on skates and a good stick handler. McQuaid is led by defenseman Pat Thornton, who played with the Lions Club Junior Hockey League last year.

The Knights are coached by Bill Peterson. Other coaches include Sid Nelson, Monroe; Ray Marling, Brighton; Andy Lang, Irondequoit, and Bill Kehoe, Fairport. Father Carter regretted that all schools which applied for league membership could not be accepted this year. He explained this was because of lack of ice facilities for practice and games.

The schedule calls for Saturday games through Feb. 22, with the possibility of playoff games thereafter.

## Combs Leads Knight Victory

Thirty points, 33 rebounds, seven assists. They all came from one man — 6-4 senior center Nick Combs — to provide McQuaid with a badly needed boost in last Saturday's 60-47 victory over Madison at McQuaid.

The game moved the Knights' record to 2-1 with cross-town rival Aquinas next in a Friday night battle that figures to pack the McQuaid gym. The Knights will travel to Monroe the following night to meet a tall Red-jacket five.

Combs was playing on a slightly sprained ankle against Madison and went scoreless for the first seven minutes.

He warmed up then, getting eight points to help the Knights to a 23-22 halftime edge, adding eight more in the third period as the count rose to 37-29, and pouring in 14 in the final eight minutes as the Knights put the game on ice. Combs hit on 14 of his 33 field goal tries while

his mates, suffering through a poor shooting night, could make only 11 of 54.

The big senior's 33 rebounds were a school record, breaking the old mark of 30 set by John Koller two seasons ago.

McQuaid trailed at 27-23 when Combs and Co. started their winning drive early in the third quarter. With Tom Combs and John McLane chipping in, the Knights went on two 7-point bursts in the next 6 minutes

to grab an 8-point lead that stood up the rest of the way.

Tom Combs joined his brother in double figures for the third straight game, with 12 points. For the losers, Willie Williams had 17, Jim McGowan 13, and Pringle Simmons 11.

In the junior varsity game, Madison came from behind to defeat McQuaid, 58-52. Earlier in the day, the McQuaid frosh evened their record at 1-1 with an 88-25 win over King's Prep.

## Government Offers Summer Job Tests

Washington, D.C. — Competitive civil service examinations for summer employment with the Federal Government will be given here Dec. 7, Jan. 11, Feb. 8 and March 8.

There will be a limited number of summer job opportunities throughout the country, ranging from office clerks to science aides and national park rangers.

Applications for the examinations can be obtained from the U.S. Civil Service Commission in Washington, from College placement offices and most post offices. The deadline for applying is Jan. 30. A candidate must be at least 18 or a high school graduate by the time of hiring.

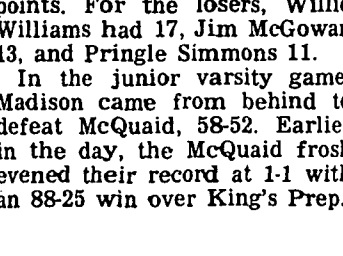

## Lay Teachers In Buffalo Win Tenure, Rights

Buffalo — (NC) — A grievance procedure system has been formally instituted for lay teachers in Buffalo diocesan high schools and, for the first time, tenure is being granted to lay teachers in these schools.

A spokesman for the diocesan school department, which announced the innovations, said Buffalo is now one of the few Catholic school systems in the country to grant tenure to the teachers.

The grievance procedure covers the 326 full and part-time lay teachers in the high school system, but excludes priest and nun-teachers.

Raymond Forton, diocesan secondary school director, said the grievance machinery means that lay teachers who feel diocesan policies are being misinterpreted by their immediate superiors have recourse to challenge these actions.
