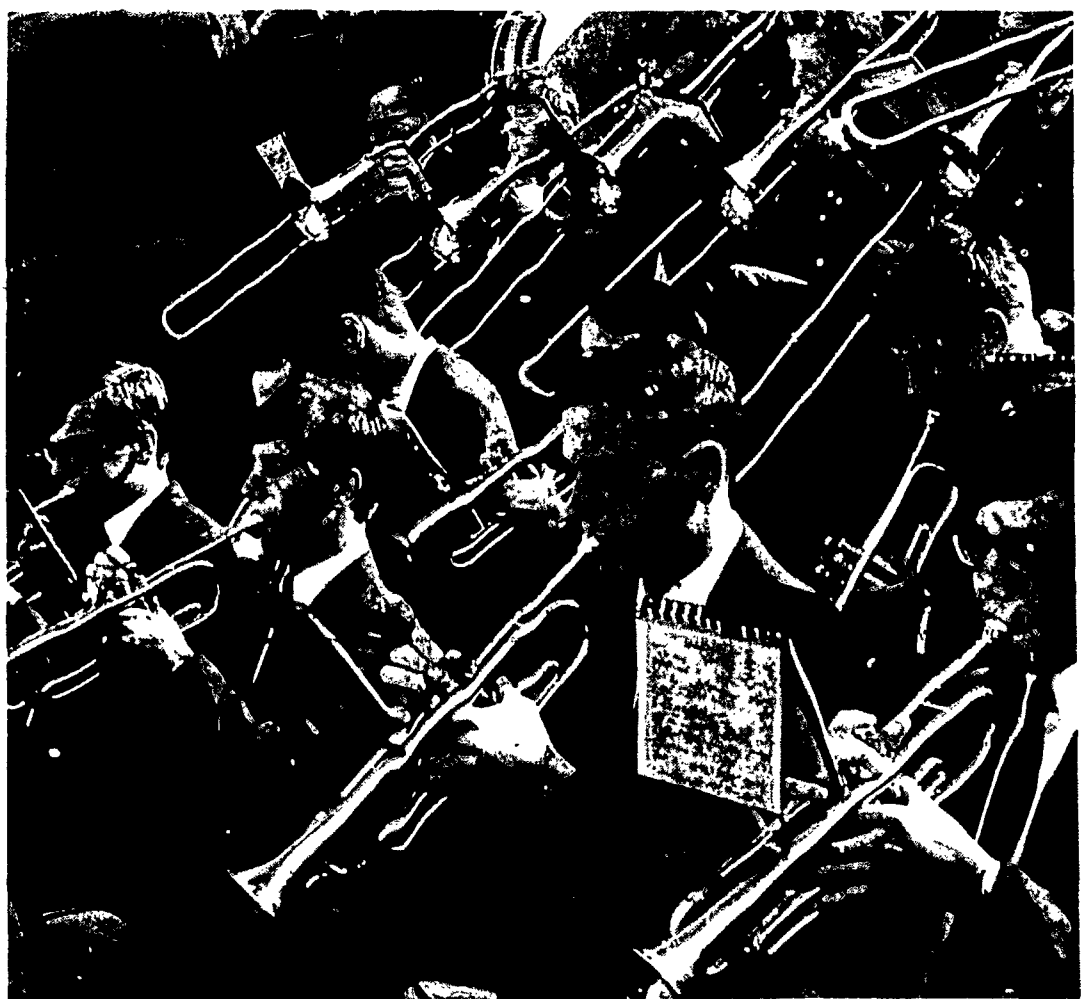
season to the young men of McQuaid Jesuit High School, who will assemble and distribute baskets of food for the needy of our community.

A traditional Latin celebration of the Eucharist is scheduled for midnight Mass at St. John of Rochester Church, in Perinton.

Hong Kong Flu? Here's What to Do

Dr. Wendell R. Ames, director of the Monroe County Department of Health, has issued the following recommendations and comments regarding the outbreak of Hong Kong flu in the community:

1—For the average person, the illness is relatively mild and is characterized by fever, muscle aches, and abdominal and respiratory upsets.

2—Bed rest, fluids, and aspirin are advisable for the relief of symptoms. Antibiotics have no effect on influenza.

3—If fever persists for more than three days or if complications occur, such as a sore throat, a physician should be consulted.

4—A vaccine for protection against Hong Kong flu is

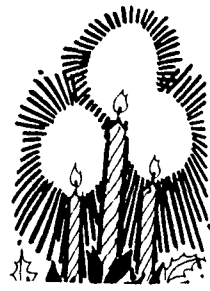
short supply, and should be reserved for use among high risk groups, such as the elderly and those with chronic heart-lung diseases.

The presence of Hong Kong flu in the community was confirmed on Dec. 12 when the Health Department laboratories isolated strains of the flu virus in patient specimens.

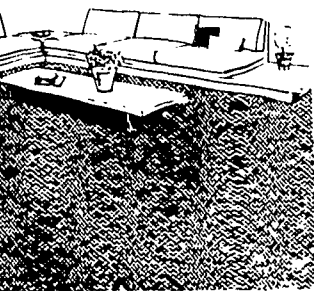

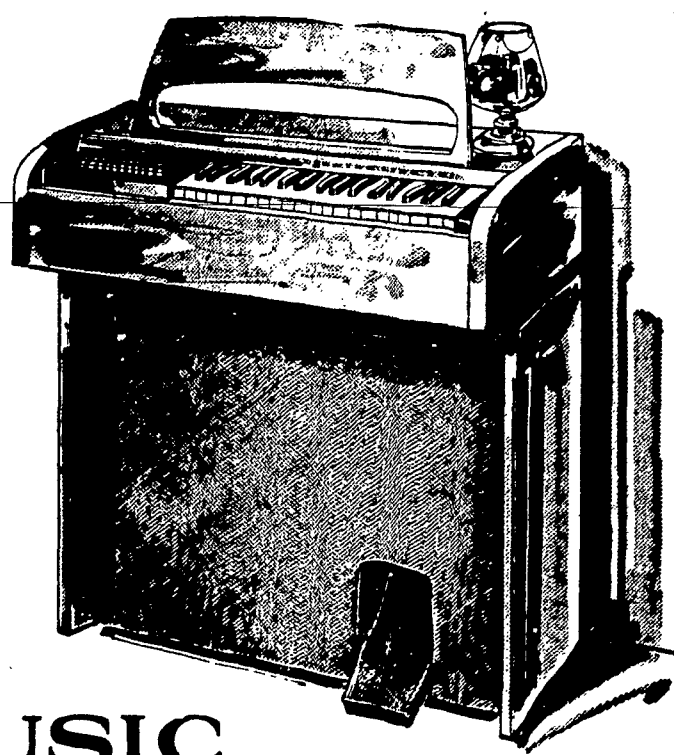
