

### NCEA Aide Praises Carnegie Report

Washington — (NC) — An official of the National Catholic Educational Association has praised a special report on federal responsibility for higher education for accentuating "educational quality and equality of opportunity."

The report by the Carnegie Commission on Higher Education said the federal government's proportionate share of support for higher education will need to rise from its present \$4 billion to over \$13 billion by 1976.

The 54-page study recommended increased federal aid in several areas, including educational opportunity grants, supplementary matching grants, a student workstudy program, a counseling and information program, medical education, and construction. It also urged the establishment of a National Foundation for the Development of Higher Education.

Father Clarence W. Friedman, associate secretary of the NCEA college and university department, said the report "sums up what is

necessary for higher education to meet the many challenges it faces."

The NCEA official praised the following recommendations of the report:

- Additional support of college undergraduates through educational opportunity grants and a federally financed work-study program that would enable undergraduates to earn up to \$500 a year in part-time employment.

- A recommendation that "the present federal aid program of guidance, counseling, and testing for identification and encouragement of able students be expanded . . . and that funding for the program be increased to \$30 million, rising to \$40 million in 1976-77."

- A recommendation that "a federal contingent loan program be created for which all students, regardless of need, would be eligible."

- A recommendation that "the federal government grant cost-of-education supplements to colleges and uni-

versities based on the numbers and levels of students holding federal grants enrolled in the institutions."

"Implementation of these recommendations," Father Friedman said, "would make it possible for virtually any needy, qualified student to attend the college of his choice. In addition, high school students would have full knowledge of the opportunities available to them for obtaining a college education. The program is so conceived that it would enable a student to receive all the education he needs up to a Ph.D. . . ."

"It has become increasingly clear that because of rising costs the private sector by itself cannot long support private institutions of higher education. Massive federal assistance in fulfillment of a national responsibility, is essential."

### Nigeria Captures Mill Hill Priest

Hopkins, Minn. — (RNS) — A Roman Catholic missionary to the west African nation of Cameroon has been captured by Nigerian troops, according to word received here by his parents.

Father Daniel Callinan, 32, has been moved from the Bifran town of Enugu to Lagos, the capital of Nigeria, his parents were informed by the U.S. State Department.

Father Callinan, a former director of Catholic Relief Services, was seized by federal Nigerian troops while on a canoe trip to a remote part of his 240-square-mile parish, Mr. and Mrs. Harry T. Callinan were told.

He has been in Cameroon for six years as a member of the Mill Hill Society, an English order with American headquarters in Albany, N.Y.

### Do We Stone Our Prophets? Mission Board is Asked

New York — (RNS) — Some revolution-minded students are "men and women of deep compassion," a Methodist mission officer told his agency.

"Theirs is a prophetic stance. Do we stone our prophets?"

The words are those of Dr. John W. Johannaber, executive secretary for mission personnel, Methodist Board of Missions.

An increasing number of conscientious objectors are turning to the missions board to find a challenging alternative to the military obligation," he said, and he asked for more "innovation and flexibility" in the board's use of such persons.

Observing that the younger generation has said it wants to "do its own things," the executive asked the board how much conformity it required to "ecclesiastical discipline, acceptable theological statement and conventional middle-class life style."

"Some students are committed to a revolutionary stance," he continued, but "they are neither wild-eyed heretics nor apostles of violence. They are men and women of deep com-

passion and have a profound sense of responsibility for and involvement with the life of all humanity.
