

# Films to Form a Christian Spirit

As the beginning of a new semester of classes nears, CCD teachers or program directors may be looking for new ideas for presenting the Christian message. Audio-visual aids are especially effective for injecting new interest into a course, and of the various A-V aids available, films are probably the most common, and when properly used, one of the most successful.

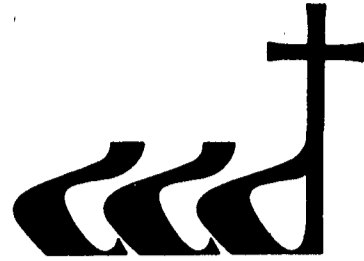
For the next few weeks this column will consider some of the excellent films available with the hope that you will incorporate some of them into your CCD program.

If you were to use just one film series in your entire CCD program, primary grades through adult level, the series to use is "Kree Finds the Way" by Roa Films. This series includes 20 contemporary art color filmstrips each 6 to 10 minutes long.

There are 3 1/2 rpm records and teaching guides for each filmstrip. The teaching guides contain not only the complete text of the recorded narration, but also background enrichment for the teacher including scriptural

references, historical and geographical setting, aims and utilization of the films, words and music of songs used in some episodes.

Also available is an excellent brochure which gives sample lesson plans for grades 3-6 which were used with the filmstrip in a Detroit summer school program. In this four-week ses-

sion the film series was shown to all children, grades 1-8. Then the children separated into classes according to grade level for instruction, discussion, and activities.

The children visited a cemetery—some heard a Mass there—they visited a farm, zoo, park, and a historical village.

They made scrapbooks, worked in committees, had small group discussions, planned puppet shows and plays, did group and individual art projects. They used paints, crayons, chalk, tissue paper. They made cellophane "stained glass" windows, mosaics, and cloth wall hangings. They wrote letters to Vietnam servicemen. They learned about the Mass, about God, and studied the Old and New Testaments.

In learning about Kree they learned about themselves and others.

Kree is a young pagan who finds himself lost in a strange land. First through his solitary encounters with nature he comes to a rudimentary belief in "The All Powerful One". He eventually discovers a Christian village and through the witness of the faith there he becomes a Christian.

The whole story and the films themselves are deceptively simple. Just as the art, which is plain to the point of starkness at points, says much with just a few brush lines.

so too do the films say much with simple unembellished episodes. This series, if properly exploited, can illustrate all the essential facets of Christianity.

An especially appropriate time to use it is at the 2-5 grade level. Used at this time it is an excellent way to present a cohesive and unified "overall" view of the Faith.
