Your sacrifices have also helped to build a new wing for the Sacred Heart Leprosy Hospital in Kumbakonam, India. This hospital now offers up to date treatment as well as a complete program of rehabilitation for leprosy patients.

In Thipel. Taiwan, your assistance has provided train-ing for catechists in an area where there is much interest in the Faith, but not enough priests, to give instructions to prospective converts.

Because of your generosity, too, we have been able to pro-vide assistance to the war-torn country of Nigeria-Biafra. Over \$1,500,000,00 has been sent into this ravaged area since the conflict began, and has been used for the needs of the Church in its mission of salvation and service. Your gifts and sacrifices are relieving human want and bringing the message and com-fort of Christ to a suffering part of the world.

In Altape, Oceania, Propagation funds have helped in the completion of a secondary school for girls. This school not only equips young women with a fine intellectual back-ground, but it also gives them practical helps for the future.

These accomplishments of the past year were made possible by YOU that is, by your love-filled sacrifices and generosity, for which we are everlastingly grateful. May we express the fervent hope that you will continue with renewed zeal and generosity to make us the instrument of your love in mission lands.
