Unbeaten Mooney 5 Overpowers Aquinas

Beating the Mooney Cardinals is tough enough under ordinary circumstances, but when your two top scorers produce just 13 points between them, it's just about impossible.

Aquinas Institute's roundballers learned that last Friday night as the Cardinals trounced the Irish, 58-36, on the Maiden Lane court.

Aquinas got just 4 points from Jerry Sussina and 9 from Bob Christian and never threatened Mooney, defending champions of the Diocesan League, received an 18-point production from Doug Farrell and 10 points from Dick Felber.

Mooney shot 47 percent from the field and 72 percent from the foul line. Aquinas was 37 percent and 45 percent, respectively.

The victory kept the Cards unbeaten over the season and first in Catholic league play. Aquinas stands at the 500 mark with five wins and five losses.

Tonight (Friday), Aquinas entertains Bishop Kearney on the R.I.T. court. The McGuiremen will be looking to their top scorers, Sussina, Christian and Bill Murrer, to offset the King's experience and depth.

Game time is 8:15 p.m. with a 7 p.m. preliminary between the schools' junior varsity squads.

McQuaid Scores Cage Victory

The McQuaid Knights scored a 60-44 win at Mt. Carmel of Auburn last Sunday. The win boosted McQuaid's record to 6-4 overall and 2-0 in C.L. action. Mt. Carmel is now 7-3.

Undeclared Cardinal Mooney (10-0) invades McQuaid, seeking to take over undignified top spot in the Catholic League.

The Knights started out cold against Mr. Carmel and trailed 15-8 after 8 minutes as Bart Copes scored 8 and Bob Balash 5 for the homers. In the second period, though, McQuaid's defense limited the Mounties to only 8 shots and 1 goal, while the attack poured in 17 points. A one-hander by Ryan gave McQuaid its first lead at 16-15 and Combs' rebound shot put the Knights ahead to stay, 19-17. Connolly's best shooting of the season netted him a game-high of 19 points, followed by Welt's 13 and Combs' 10.

The Bishop Kearney junior varsity defeated McQuaid 59-33. Bishop Kearney will meet Aquinas tonight (Friday) in the Kearney gym. The Jayvets start at 7, the Varsity at 8:30.

The Center, through the assistance of many volunteers, provides food, clothing, counseling, companionship and recreation for hundreds of adults and children in the "inner city" of Clinton Joseph Avenue neighborhood. It receives no funds from any organized public source.

Concert to Honor Toronto Composer

"Homage to Healey Willan" is the theme of a special musical commemoration to be held at the Christ Church Cathedral at 4:00 p.m. this Sunday, sponsored by the Rochester Chapter of the American Guild of Organists.

The late Canadian composer's liturgical music will be sung by the cathedral choir, directed by the Rev. Canon Cyril V. Roberts, Canon Precentor of the Episcopal Diocese of Rochester, assisted by Derrill Bodley, the cathedral organist.

Healey Willan, a major figure in the history of church music, was born in England in 1880 and lived in Toronto from 1913 until his death last year. He taught at the Toronto Conservatory and the University of Toronto.

Among Dr. Willan's compositions that attracted general attention were pieces written for the coronation of King George VI in 1937 and of Queen Elizabeth II in 1953; a Song of "Welcome for the Stratford Shakespearean Festival in 1955; and a Centennial March for Canada's hundredth anniversary as a Dominion in 1967.
