Prelate Deplores Spain's Low Wages

Cadiz, Spain — (NC) — The difference between the legal minimum daily wage and the needs of the average Spanish family was deplored as a "serious and vital discrepancy" by the bishop of Cadiz.

Bishop Antonio Anoveros, 59, a former lawyer and much in the public eye for his outspoken pastoral letters on social conditions in Andalusia, compared the minimum wage of \$1.50 a day with what he said was the \$4 daily needed by an average family of four.

The bishop himself donated his residence for the use of poor families and lives with his mother. Long ago he auctioned for social aid purposes the gem-rimmed golden ring he received at his consecration.
