## Kearney Shares Pair

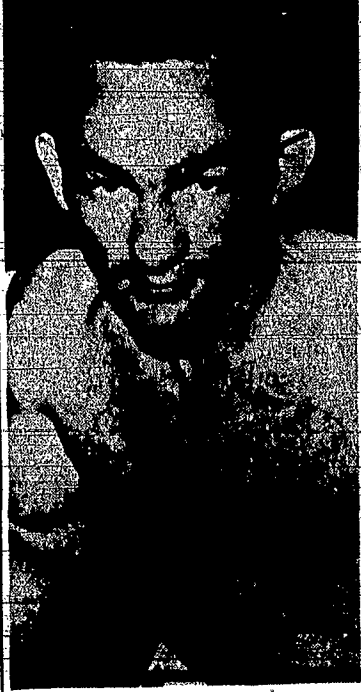

The Bishop Kearney basketball team galloped to an 86-54 win over Sodus last Friday, and then on Saturday saw its win streak halted at three games with a loss to Monroe 90-67.

The weekend results brought Kearney's record to 8-7 overall. The Kings will be shooting for their second Catholic League victory to night when they play undefeated Cardinal Mooney on the opponent's court.

Kearney led at the end of every quarter in the Sodus game, with John Maurer topping the scoring with 17 points. Captain Den Fitzpatrick and Rick Yeager turned in 16 point performances. Austin Snead was high man for the Spartans with 30 points.

Rufus Green and Royal Cook were the game's heroes on the Monroe court Saturday night. Green's jumpers found the hoop for 31 points, while Royal Cook scored 23 for the Redjackets. Fitzpatrick and John Maurer topped the King effort with 21 points each.

The Kearney JV's won both their games, 94-43 over Sodus, and 68-61 over Monroe.

## Only the Thrill Left For Aquinas Cagers

Aquinas Institute's basketball team has a 5-8 record and is out of the running for a league title. The team can salvage something, however, by knocking off its archrival McQuaid Jesuit High.

The Irish will battle the McQuaid-Knights tomorrow night at the old R.I.T. gym. The opening whistle is set for 8:15 p.m. with a junior varsity preliminary at 7 p.m.

Closing out Aquinas' schedule this year will be meetings with Kearney, Monroe and league-leading Mooney.

Aquinas has lost to all three local Catholic high schools earlier in the season, dropping a 51-49 decision to the Knights, being edged 62-59 by Kearney and losing 58-38 to the Cardinals.

Aquinas will have to keep its mistakes to a minimum against

the Knights Saturday night. McQuaid is second in the Catholic league and has plenty of firepower sparked by brothers Nick and Tom Combs.

Coach Jerry McGuire will go with the same starting lineup he's used the last three games, but will not hesitate to go to his bench early.

Senior Gerry Sussina, the team's only double-figure scorer, will lead the attack. Bob Christian doubles as a passer and defender and Gerry Lasponara is a strong rebounder. Bill Murrer and Bill Woodward round out the rest of the starting lineup. Murrer is a tough man on defense and a good ballhandler. Woodward is strong under the boards.

Last Saturday Madison defeated Aquinas for the second time this season, 51-44, in the R.I.T. gym. Gerry Sussina and Bill Woodward led the Irish with 13 points each with Gerry Lasponara adding 10 more.
