Confrontation

CCD Need: The Professional

One of the most urgent needs in CCD today is the need to recruit, train, and employ high quality, professional, full-time personnel. This need was emphasized in the National CCD Survey and is considered one of the most pressing needs in the Diocese of Rochester, according to Msgr. Schmacke and Father Holland, director and assistant director, respectively, of CCD in this Diocese.

CCD personnel generally are volunteer, part-time workers. As a group they do an admirable job, considering the monstrous task facing them and the many handicaps, such as limited time and resources, with which they must contend.

However, as CCD becomes recognized not as the poor stepchild of the parish religious education program that it has often been, but as the nucleus of parish educational activities, it becomes more and more evident that the time for organization is upon us.

The CCD Office is most concerned with present and future demands on the CCD programs of the Diocese. In view of this and recognizing the need for professional level organization and guidance as stated above, the CCD Office working with the CCD Lay Advisory Board is formulating an organizational plan for religious education in the Diocese. Its goals and proposals indicate the type of planning and implementing that must take place during the next several years.

The plans call for a full-time, professional, paid coordinator of religious education in every parish by the mid 1970s. This person will plan, implement, and coordinate all religious education in the parish—from pre-school to adult. He also will work

with persons involved in any parish function associated with religious education, and act as liaison with the Diocesan Office to stay abreast of all activities, policies, new materials and techniques available.

Requirements for this position would include background in teaching, communication, working with people, Catechetics, Scripture, Theology, Sociology, Guidance, and the willingness to keep up to date in Catechetics.

The plan also calls for 10 full-time, professional, paid diocesan personnel with Master's degrees in Religious Education or its equivalent by 1971. These must be visionary people who can organize and do in-depth study and planning, and who can work well with priests, religious, and laity. They would be responsible for training parish coordinators, in-service training

for teachers, developing programs, and supervising catechetical centers. They must be specialists in communication, audio-visuals, teacher training, and curriculum.

The CCD Office would contribute to this program by conducting orientation programs for pastors as well as for laymen and religious in the program. The office would also hold monthly meetings covering new developments in Catechetics, field trips and workshops.
