Seminarians Learn about Religion in Russia

The potential power of the Christian Church in Russia to be a link uniting East and West obliges U.S. Catholics to study religious life in the Soviet Empire, according to an Anglican priest, Rev. Michael Bourdeaux, newest member of the St. Bernard's Seminary faculty.

"The western Christian world is waking up to understanding that the Church in Russia will be both an ecumenical and perhaps a political bridge between the Soviet nation and the entire West," Father Bourdeaux believes.

A priest from the Anglican Diocese of Rochester, England, he has just begun a semester's teaching here. Some 50 seminarians are taking the elective course, "Religion in the Soviet Empire." It involves two lectures and two seminars a week.

"St. Bernard's is the only seminary I know of which is concerned to prepare young clerics for understanding the Russian Church of today and the future."

The course was created for him nearly a year ago by Bishop Sheen, Father Bourdeaux said, because of the Bishop's long interest in Communism and the presence of Douglas Hyde, former British Communist, on the seminary faculty in '67-'68.

Critical of the World Council of Churches for its indifference to current harass-

ment of Christians by the Soviet government Father Bourdeaux declared: "The WCC knows the brutal situation in Russia—the imprisonments and deportations and church closings—but it continues to further its relations with the official Russian Church than with the church under persecution."

He could offer very little detail about the persecution of Roman Catholics and Eastern Catholics in Russia. "But the situation in the Ukraine and West Russia (border lands of Poland and

Lithuania) is tragic." He stated: "Bishops, priests and laity—by the thousands, were sent into Siberia in '45 and only a few ever returned. They were broken men."

Author of three books on Russian religious issues and widely known for articles in scholarly periodicals, Father Bourdeaux has recently worked at the Center of Research for Religious Institutions in Geneva, Switzerland. A graduate of Oxford University where he took degrees in Russian, French and theology the visiting scholar did post-

graduate work in Moscow State University in 1959.

Studies there and extensive travel in Russia resulted in three books on the relations of Church and State in the USSR: "Patriarch and Prophet," "Religious Ferment in Russia" and "Opium of the People."

Born of an Anglican family and educated in a Methodist school, his Oxford studies in foreign languages helped shape his vocation to the Anglican priesthood—in which he was ordained in 1960.

"I conceived that my vocation in the service of God and the Church was to put my language skills into the work of aiding East-West religious relations—officially. Although I have written extensively, outside church sponsorship, the St. Bernard's teaching opportunity is the first official Church use of my vocational dream."

1040 U.S. Individual Taxpayers Ask IRS

Q. — Does IRS have anything that would explain the taxes a small businessman has to pay?

A. — There is a "Mr. Businessman's Kit," Publication 454, which can be obtained from local IRS offices. The IRS also has a publication called "Tax Guide for Small Business," Publication 334, which should be extremely helpful to you. It may be obtained by sending 60 cents to your District Office or the Superintendent of Documents.

Q. — I may be able to claim my uncle as a dependent. What items do you include when figuring out support?

A. — Support includes food, shelter, clothing, medical and dental care, educational and similar expenses. If items provided as support are goods or lodging then the fair market value of these items should be used.

Check the 1040 instructions for further information on dependency tests.

Q. — My home was damaged by floods last year. Is there anything I can deduct for this on my federal income tax?

A. — Yes, you may be able to deduct your loss as a casualty loss when you file your return. For details on how to determine what you may deduct, send a post card to your district director and ask for a free copy of Publication 547, "Tax Information on Disasters, Casualty Losses, and Thefts."

Subliminal Aids Defended

Vatican City (NC) — Referring to subliminal advertising as "hidden persuasion," an Italian theologian said there is nothing wrong in using it, but the advertiser must believe in his product.

"Nothing forbids an advertiser to use all the resources of his intelligence and his profession," wrote Perugia's Archbishop Ferdinando Lambruschini in L'Osservatore della Domenica, Vatican City weekly.

Archbishop Lambruschini was referring to advertising in movies on TV where a word is flashed on the screen so quickly that the human eye barely sees it, yet the word makes an impression on the viewer's subconscious mind.

Such a method would see to be "almost an attack on the autonomy of personal choice," the archbishop wrote. But, he added, "for our part we do not think we have to be so categorical and we prefer to reason differently."

The former professor of moral theology at Rome's Lateran University argued that these "methods of hidden per-
