Lecture Scheduled On Mass Media

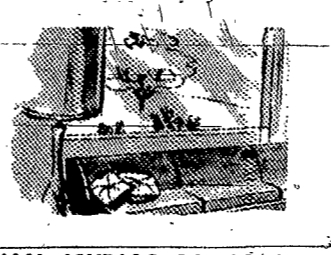

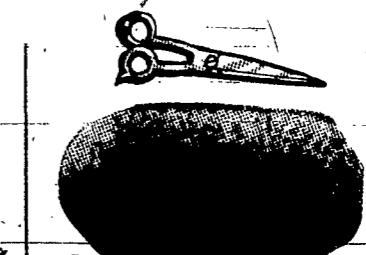
