

# 8 Diocesan Teams Seek Cage Title

Eight Catholic boys high schools of the diocese will compete in the 11th annual Diocesan Basketball Tournament on two successive weekends, March 7-8 and March 15-16.

Results of games on the first weekend will send winners into the semi-finals on Saturday, March 15, and the championship game on Sunday, March 16. These games are scheduled for the Monroe Community College gym.

Tourney participants include:

Aquinas, Rochester; Bishop Kearney, Irondequoit; Cardinal Mooney, Greece; McQuaid, Mt. Carmel, Auburn; Notre Dame, Elmira; De Sales, Geneva, and St. Anthony of Padua, Watkins Glen.

Aquinas and McQuaid have won four championships. Cardinal Mooney took the crown for the last two years. There never has been a winner from outside the Rochester area, although Notre Dame, Mt. Carmel and De Sales have reached the finals.

# Knights Upset East

A new addition to McQuaid's lineup almost gave the Knights two victories over two of the top-rated schools in the state last weekend. On Friday, despite a tremendous second-half effort by junior John McLane, McQuaid lost, 95-51, to a tough Cardinal Mooney team. But on Saturday, the Knights bounced back behind McLane and Nick Combs to defeat East High, 49-35.

The Knights thus show an 11-7 record heading into tonight's Diocesan Tournament quarter-final game against Mt. Carmel of Auburn at St. John Fisher gym.

Against East, McQuaid took control early and lost the lead only once, at 8-6. Ahead, 10-8, at the quarter, the Knights

sprinted for 8 points by Nick Combs and 5 by Tom to take a 21-12 lead. East closed it to 25-19 at the half on the jump-shooting of Willie Grimes.

The visitors thwarted McQuaid's attempt to widen the lead by McLane, after entering the game for Tom Combs who had 4 fouls, hit on 4 layups and a foul shot to push the Knights ahead by as much as 14 points. East, hitting on only 32 percent of its shots, never seriously threatened after that.

Nick Combs, with 21 points and 18 rebounds, closed out his home career with one of his finest performances. McLane and Bob Madden each added nine.

# Mooney CYO Tournament Begins Tomorrow

Color Cardinal Mooney the Catholic Basketball League champion.

The Cardinals defeated McQuaid, 35-31, last week to nail down their third straight league title.

Dick Feber and Pete Castle scored 10 points each to pace Mooney to its sixth win without defeat in the league and a 16-1 overall record, its loss coming at the hands of East High.

McQuaid, in the running for the league title going into the game, finished with a 4-2 league record and now has a 10-7 overall record.

Tom Combs netted 14 points and John McLane 10 for the losers.

# Kearney Outlasts Holley 5, 57-51

Bishop Kearney, finding it hard to come back after losing to Aquinas 50-49 the night before, hustled to gain a 57-51 victory over Holley Saturday night. The loss put Holley's record at 10-6, while the Kearney cagers finished their season with a 6-12 mark.

Den Fitzpatrick, who crashed the boards for 28 rebounds, and Rich Yaeger led the winning Kings with 17 points each. Larry Rogers scored 13 for the cause. Don Davis and Dave Landry led the losers with 19 and 14 points, respectively.

Thirty-two teams from 11 communities in the diocese, consisting of some 600 boys and 300 cheerleaders, will participate in the annual CYO Basketball Diocesan Tournament this weekend, March 8 and 9.

It will close out a season which has seen 3,450 boys of grammar and high school age take part.

For the first time, part of the tournament this year will be played at St. Anthony's School, Elmira.

# Aquinas Edges Kearney, 50-49

Aquinas Institute's basketball team survived a head-spinning last period to edge Bishop Kearney, 50-49, last Friday evening at the old R.I.T. gymnasium.

The Irish, who looked as though they would read their own obituary, withstood a late surge to throttle the scrappy Kearney quintet. Aquinas, shooting 35 per cent, won the

war off the backboards. Kearney was accurate 32 per cent of the time from the field.

Gerry McGuire's Irish broke an eight-game losing streak to finish their regular season with 6 wins against 11 losses. Kearney conclude at 6-12.

Behind 14-11 at the end of the first period, Gerry Sussina provided the second period lift to put Aquinas ahead, 27-23 at the intermission. Sussina was

high scorer for the game with 20 points, 16 of them in the first half.

Kearney moved ahead during the third stanza, 37-36, chiefly on the sharpshooting of Capt. Den Fitzpatrick. But in the last period the lead changed hands five times with Aquinas hanging on at the final buzzer.

# Irish Bowlers Capture Crown

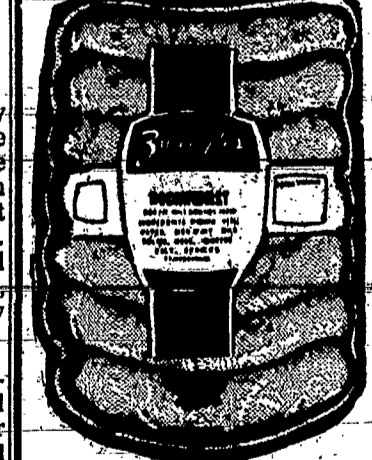

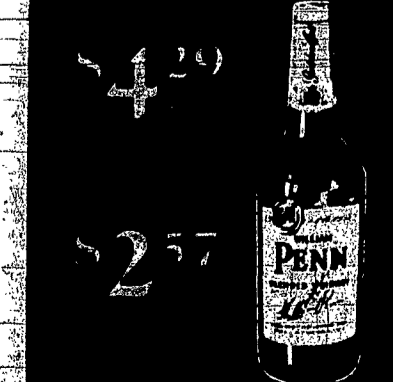
