### Aquinas Schedules Guard Competition Mar. 22 at Fisher

In a spectacular splash of color ushering in the spring season, ten expertly drilled and nattily uniformed color guard units will perform in the St. John Fisher gymnasium on Saturday, March 22.

The competition is the Aquinas Institute Invitational Color Guard contest, a showdown contest featuring the outstanding guard units in the state. The much heralded Sherburne Guard and the Wildcats from Camillus head the roster of competing units.

Eying honors also are the Bishop Kearney Guard, the Wavettes, the Blue Angels, the Greece Cadets, the Nazareth Academy Guard, the Emerald Cadets and the Alpine Girls.

The New York State championship Aquinas Guard will give an exhibition. The Aquinas Guard, an integral part of the school's marching band holds the Canadian Open Championship. Last September in New Orleans the contingent missed the national championship by seven tenths of a point. In Toronto last Saturday the unit won the Optimists International championship for the third consecutive year.

### Music Festival Set at Mooney

The orchestra will be under the direction of Sister Margaret Caulfield, R.S.M., Vocal Music Supervisor of the Sisters' of Mercy schools in the Diocese, who is presently in charge of the Music Department at St. John the Evangelist School, Humboldt Street.

The Inter-Parochial Band will be under the baton of Mr. Roger Eckers, a teacher of music at Sperry Senior High and Carlton Webster Junior High.
